By the KING. A PROCLAMATION.

THEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the twenty-fifth day of this instant November; We, with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said twenty-fifth day of this instant November, to Tuesday the third day of February next; and We have given order to Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a commission for proroguing the same accordingly; and We do further hereby, with the advice afore-said, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said third day of February next, be held and sit for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs : And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said third day of February next.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, the eighteenth day of November one thousand eight hundred and twenty-three, and in the fourth year of Our reign.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the fourth VV year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled VV Order in Council, of the twenty-first of Fe-An Act to authorise His Majesty, under bruary last, for prohibiting the exportation of

" certain circumstances, to regulate the duties and " drawbacks on goods imported or exported in " foreign vessels, and to exempt certain foreign " vessels from pilotage," His Majesty is authorised, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, or by any Order or Orders in Council, in all cases in which British vessels, of less burthen than sixty tons, are not required by law to take pilots, to exempt foreign vessels, being of less burthen than sixty tons, from taking of board a pilot to conduct them into or from any of the ports of the United Kingdom, any law, custom, or usage to the con-trary notwithstanding; His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in him by the said Act, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the date of this Order, all vessels belonging to the subjects of His Majesty the King of Hanover, and being of less burthen than sixty tons, which shall enter in or clear out from any of the ports of the United Kingdom, shall be, and they are hereby exempted from taking on board a pilot to conduct them into or from any such port, in all cases where British vessels, being of less burthen than sixty tons, are not required by law to take pilots, any law, custom, or usage to the con-trary notwithstanding : and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions therein accordingly. HEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's

Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar), has expired; and whereas it is judged expedient that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service), do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the date of this Order), presume to transport any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar) or ship or lade any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf, first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Second, intituled "An Act " to empower His Majesty to prohibit the expor-" tetion of guardina and a second a second and a second " tation of gun-powder, or any sort of arms or " ammunition, and also to empower His Majesty " to restrain the carrying coastwise of salt-petre, " gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammuni-" tion;" and also by an Act, passed in the thirtythird year of His late Majesty's reign, cap. 2, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to " restrain the exportation of naval stores, and " more effectually to prevent the exportation of " salt-petre, arms, and ammunition, when prohi-" bited by Proclamation or Order in Council:
