Naples, Fanudry 12 :

THE fixth Infant arrived here our new Vice. foy, the Marquifs de Lithe: On Monday next he will make his pablick Entry, and take pofeffion of the Government, which is as yef in the hands of the Marquifs de los Velez.
${ }_{5}$ Venice, Feb. $\sigma$, 1 his Srate is going to encreale irs Forces: and we are told that a League is Negotiating for the preferving the Peace of fialy. Our Letters from Rome of the 25 paft inform uss That the Pope had ordered that 200 thoufand Ctởwns Thall be forthwith remitted to his Nuncio at Yienna, to be employed in the War againft the Turks: and that the Pope had written to the Mof Chrillian King to exhort him to employ his Arms againft the Turks, and for that end co accommodate the Diffirences he has with the Princes his Neighbours.

Viemay Feb. 4. The 2 palt the new Treaty of Alliance concladed between the Emperor and the Elector of Byuaria, was Signed by the Imperial Commifioners, and by the Vice-Chancellor of Bavaria, and the next day an Exprefs was difpatched to Municken, to give his Elcetoral Highnefs? Account of it; By this Treaty the Elector, as we are told, is obliged to furnifh 13000 Min for the Service of the Emperor. Two days fince arrived liere an Exprefs from Turin to call thither the Prince of Savol, who had taken upun him the Command of a Regiment of Dragoons in the Emperors Service. From Hungary we have Adivice, That the States of the Upper-Hungary, purfuant to Count Teckeley's Summons, were affembled at Cafcbawo , and that Count Teckeley had propored to them; Firf, That they Ghould acknowledge him Duke or Prince of Frungary; Secondly 4 That they thould raife the 40000 Crowns that are to be paid yearly to the Turks; Thirdly, That when He takes the Field the Gentry thall be obliged to mount on Horfeback, and to follow him. However we have ftill hopes of Pesce.

Vienna, Feb. 7. The Prince of Savoy parted from hence on Monday lalt for Turin. The Exprefs that was fent to Municken is come back with the Etector of Beortia's Katification of the Treaty that was Signed here the as of the laft Month. It is reported, that the following Articles or Conditions are of fered by the Grand Signior to the flungarians.

1. That Count Emericke Teckeley de Retzmitrh, of the IIIftri,us Houfe of Prince Gabriel Betbetem, fhall be Eftablifhed King of Hungary, and that upon his deceafe the Grand Signior will take the Queen, hisWife, whofe Father loft his Life for his Fidelity to the Port, as well her Perfon asher Lands, under his Protection. 2. That the Humgarians, after the disath of Count Teckeley and his Children, fhall bs at liberty to choofe whom they pleafe to be their

King, but thall He obliged to give notice of their Election to the port. $\xi^{3}$. That the Honorary Prefent of 40000 Crowns which the Erumgarians have promifed'to pay the-Grand Signior every year, thall not $b^{2}$ augniented on any pretence whatfoever. 4. That the Hungarians fhall be minintaned in all their Priviledges, Liberties; Franchifes, and Immunitfes. 5. That the Grand Signior will defend Eliem againft all their Enemies whatever. 6. That he will affift Count Teckeley to fub tue alt that do oppole him in EFurgary. 7. That he will not make a Peace with the Germans, but with the inctafion of the Hungarizns. 8. That he will put into the hands of the Anngarians all the Places which the Ottomas Forces fhall take, in the fame condition they fhall find them. 9. That he will inviolably maintaio, in as much as they concern the EJumgrians, the Conditions of l'eacs made with, the Germins at St. Gochard. 10. That the Jefuits Thall be banithed Hurgary, and never again received there, and fach Perfons as hall endeavour their re-eftabliftment thall be fevercly punifhed. ix. That the Tribate of the Places that have yielded fhall not be angmented, but what they pay to the Port and to the Hungarians @all be continued in the fame manner it is now. 12. The Eung arian Trea. firety thatt trave free paflage through the ottontst Territories. 33. And coming to the Port with the yearly Prefents, or upon any orher occafion, thall be ryonourably received. 14. The Grand Signior will by his Oath and Imperial Wort oblige himfelf. and aN the Ottoman Nation, faithfully and punctu: ally to obrerve theic Articles, unlels the Efungarians do on their part break them.

Rethbomne, Feb. II. The latter end of the laft week arrived here an Exprefs from Parir, who, we underftand, brought the Count de Crecy Orders to receive the Propofals that lhould be made to him. by the Dyet, and to Treat with them thercupon, without any limitation of time: but withal to let them know, that his Molt Cbriftian Majefty does not now look upon himfelf to be obliged to make good the Conditions he offered by his Ambaffadors at Frencfort, and by his Minifter here, but that he will takefuch meafures, as be fhall think moft convenient. In the mean time the Electoral Colledge and that of the Princes cannot agree in the firf fteps that are to be made in Treating with the Count de Crecy; and the Emperor continues to prefs them to take immediately in hand the point of the publick fecurity, that the fafety of the Empire may in this dangerous conjuncture be provided for ; but the Electoral Colledge declare, they think it neceffary firf to accommodate matters with France, which being done, they may turn their whole care and application to eltablifh the molt effectual means for their common defence againft the Turks.

Cologne, Feb. 19. Things have been of late in
great diforder here, and a general Commotion was fe.red; but the Magiftates foving given the Burghers fatifaction upon polt of ther demands, they are at preent-pricty quict. Our Elecfor, hàs drawn bis Troops nac of Num; Kedermaerla Ann, Kemper, and other places in the lower Diocefs, Which making about $20: 0$ Mer, , are marched-to Donne, but with what defign we know not.
