## REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE COURT OF ST. JAMES'S.

**T**HE Ladies who propose to attend the Drawing-Room, to be held on Thursday the 20th instant, are requested to bring with them two cards with their names thereon written, one to be left with the King's Page in Attendance in the Presence Chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord in Waiting, who will announce the name to His Majesty; and those Ladies who are to be presented, are hereby informed it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Lady who is to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's-Office, on Wednesday the 19th of May, before twelve o'clock, in order that they may be submitted for the King's approbation, it being His Majesty's command, that no presentations at the Drawing-Room shall hereafter be made by the Lord in Waiting, but by the Lady whose name, with that of the Lady to be presented, shall appear on the card, to be delivered as before directed, corresponding with the names sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's-Office.

No Lady can be received by His Majesty at the Drawing-Room, but in conformity to the above regulations.

**WHEREAS** the Select Committee appointed to try and determine the merits of the petition of Edward Rose Tunno, Esq. complaining of an undue election and return for the borough of Bossinney, in the county of Cornwall, have this day reported to the House of Commons:

That it appeared to the said Committee, that the merits of the petition depended upon the right of election; and that therefore the said Committee required the Counsel for the parties to deliver to the Clerk of the said Committee, statements in writing of the right of election for which they contend:

That in consequence thereof the Counsel for the petitioner delivered in a statement as follows:

“ That the right of voting is in the freeholders of lands within the borough, being also inhabitant householders therein :”

That the Counsel for the sitting Member delivered in a statement as follows:

“ That the right of voting in the borough of Bossinney is in the free Burgesses of the said borough, possessed of lands of inheritance within the same, and resident within the parish of Tingel; such free Burgesses having been previously presented by a jury at one of the Courts Leet of the said borough, and sworn in accordingly.”

That upon the statement delivered in by the Counsel for the petitioner, the said Committee have determined,

That the right of voting as set forth in the said statement, is not the right of voting for the borough of Bossinney, in the county of Cornwall.
