An Act to reduce the duties on rum, the produce of the British Colonies or Plantations in America, imported into the United Kingdom.

An Act to continue, until the fifth day of July one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, the Acts for granting bounties on the exportation of refined sugar from the United Kingdom, and for reducing the size of the packages in which refined sugar may be exported.

An Act to amend and render more effectual the several Acts, for the issuing of Exchequer Bills for

An Act to defray the charge of the pay, clothing, and contingent and other expences of the disembodied militia in Great Britain and Ireland, and to grant allowances in certain cases to subaltern officers, adjutants, quartegnasters, surgeons, assistant-surgeons, surgeon's-mates, and serjeant-majors of militia, until the twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five.

An Act to continue, until the tenth day of October one thousand eight hundred and twenty-neven, an Act relating to duties of Excise on crown,

flint, and phial glass, and to alter certain laws of Excise relating to flint glass, and also an Act for suspending part of the duties on sweets or made wines.

An Act to continue for two years, and to amend an Act of the fifty-sixth year of His late Majesty, for establishing regulations respecting aliens arriving in or resident in this kingdom, in certain cases.

An Act to amend an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for amending the laws respecting the solemnization of marriages in England."

An Act for amending former Acts relative to the British Museum.

An Act to amend an Act of the last session of Parliament, for making more effectual regulations for the election and for securing the performance of the duties of County Treasurers in Ireland.

An Act to prevent the stealing of records, deeds, and papers in Ireland.

An Act to explain and amend an Act of the Parliament of Ireland, passed in the thirty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, for the better ascertaining the amount and securing the payment of the bills of costs of Proctors employed in carrying on and defending suits, and transacting business in the High Court of Admiralty, in His Majesty's Court of Prerogative, in the Court of Delegates, and in all Ecclesiastical Courts within the Kingdom of Ireland.

An Act to amend an Act of the third year of His present Majesty's reign, for the appointment of constables in Ireland.

An Act for making and maintaining a navigable

canal from the River Lee Navigation, in the parish of Saint Mary, Stratford Bow, in the county of Middlesex, to join the Regent's Canal, at or near a place called Old Ford Lock, in the parish of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, in the said county of Middlesex.

An Act to authorise the Company of Proprietors of the Stockton and Darlington Railway, to relinquish one of their branch railways, and to enable them to make another branch railway in lieu thereof, and to enable the said Company to raise a further sum of money, and to enlarge the powers and provisions of the several Acts relating to the said railway.

An Act for making a railway from Palace-Craig, in the parish of Old Monkland, in the county of Langrk, to the Forth and Clyde Canal, near Kirk-

intillock, in the county of Dumbarton.

An Act for enlarging the powers and provisions of an Act of His late Majesty, intituled "An Act for taking down and rebuilding the parish church of Blackburn, in the county palatine of Lancaster, and for providing additional burial-ground, and for equalizing the church rates in the said parish, and other purposes.

An Act for establishing and regulating a market, and for erecting a town-hall and market-place, in the township of Bilston, in the county of Stafford.

An Act for repealing so much of an Act of the thirteenth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for appointing wardens and assay-masters for assaying wrought plate in the towns of Sheffield and Birmingham, as relates to the town of Birmingham, and within twenty miles thereof, and for granting further and more effectual powers for assaying and marking gold and silver plate wrought or made within the said town of Birmingham, and within thirty miles thereof, and for other purposes relating thereto.

Bounty on linen exported from Ireland to certain places, to be paid on such linen exported to the East Indies, as in Great Britain, under the laws in force.

No bounty to be allowed on any linen exported from Ireland, unless the same is of the breadth of twenty-five inches and upwards, in like manner as in Great Britain, under the laws in force.

The bounty payable in Ireland, of 1½d per square yard, on diaper, huckaback, and sheeting, not to be paid unless such goods exceed the value of one shilling and six pence the running yard, in like manner as in Great Britain, under the laws in force.

IN GREAT BRITAIN.

IN lieu of the present countervailing duty and drawback on flint, phial, enamel, stained, or paste glass, a countervailing duty of £5 8s. — cwt. to be charged on importation from Ireland, and a drawback of the same amount to be allowed on the exportation of such glass to Ireland, provided the

packages do not contain each less than 100fb weight avoirdupois, and that they be not imported in any vessel of less than seventy tons burthen.

ADDITIONAL RULES and ORDERS for Regulating the Trade between Great Britain and Ireland, directed by the Lords Commsssioners of His Majesty's Treasury to be observed.

ARTICLES OF FOREIGN PRODUCE.

THAT articles of the following description, for which the duties have been paid, be accompanied, on the removal from one country to the other, by Excise permits, testifying the payment of the duties, viz. foreign spirits, tea, tobacco and snuff, wine, coffee, and cocoa-nuts, and pepper.

Regulations are established by Act of 4 Geo. IV, cap. 24, for the removal of such of the beforementioned articles, except tea, as have not paid the duties, but are taken from the warehouses in which they have been lodged upon bond, and tea may be removed from the East India Company's warehouses to Ireland, without payment of duty, under regulations established by Act of 41 Geo. III, cap. 75.

ARTICLES OF HOME GROWTH OR MANU-FACTURE.

That articles subject to countervailing duties (except bricks and tiles, and common glass bottles) be put into convenient packages, marked and numbered; and that each of the packages of candles, soap, starch, hair-powder, and British gum contain not less than 100lb avoirdupois, net weight.

That all paper, button-board, mill-board, scale-board, and paste-board be removed in the original packages, having the stamp and other marks, denoting that the duty, payable in the country from which removed, has been duly charged, perfect thereon.

That sweets or made wines, passing from the premises of the maker for sale, be accompanied by certificates to shew that the duties have been paid.

That British hops continue in the original bags or pockets, with the marks required by law to be placed thereon perfect, and the package unbroken.

The trade in spirits between Great Britain and Ireland is regulated by Act of 54 Geo. III, cap. 149.

That on the arrival of articles liable to countervailing duties in Great Britain, in addition to the entry required to be made with the Collector of the Customs, an entry be made thereof with the Collector of Excise, and the countervailing duties paid to him, and the goods not landed without his warrant.

And that the drawback allowed in this case be paid, under all the rules and regulations which are established by law, in regard to the exportation of exciseable commodities with drawback.
