**Chilon, as well as charge.** From Ratisborne we have an account, That the Electoral Coffedge will treat with the Count de Greey upon the French King's Propofals, but the Colledge of Princes will not; That the Imperial Commifficuer, the Bilhop d'Aicbfladt, prefies them both to difpatch the Point of the publick Security: But that the Electoral Colledge will not enter upon that matter till a Peace be effablifhed between the Empire and France, and that in this the Colledge of Princes likewile differ from them, for the le have declared they will at the fame time that they Treat with the Count de Crey, deliberate concerning the making the neceffary Provifion for the defence and fecutity of the Empire.

Francfort, Feb. 26. The Emperor, as we are in-formed, will call all his Troops out of the Empire, except only three or four Thouland Men, to employ them in the War against the Turks, and in their flead the Elector of Bavaria is to furnilh a body of Men for his Imperial Majefties Service in the Empirc. The Magifirates of this City having excufed their receiving an Imperial Gariton, are themselves providing for their Security, as far as they think the prefent conjuncture tequires it. We have had the prefent conjuncture fequires it. feveral Letters from Hungary which speak of the arrival of the Grand Vizier at Belgrade, but those we receive from Fienna do not give any certain account of it; In this all our advices agree, That the Preparations of the Turks are very great, and that according to all appearance they will fall in a very numerous Body into Hungdry, fo foon as the Weather will permit it; That Count Teckeley has a very close and fecres Correspondence with them, and that he proposes to himself great advantages from their affiftance and protection.

Cologne, Feb. 26. The Letters from Liege bringing an account, That the Commonalty of that City cannot be prevailed with to give out Elector the fatisfaction he demands, His Electoral Highnels has refolved to make use of Force to compel them thereunto, and we are told, That his Miniflers are preparing a Manifesto against the faid City, which will be very specifily published. We have advice from Soefs, That there are as yet only arrived the Ministers of the King of Denmark, of the Electors of Brandenburg and Cologne, and the Bishop of Munifer. The Duke de Croy, who & Levying in these parts a Regiment of 2000 Foot for the Emperers Service, has already railed 1000, who will very quickly Marth for Bohemia, where they have their Quarters assigned them.

Hamburg, Feb. 26. The King of Denmark raifes what Seamen he can, as well here as at Aluena, for the Service of the Fleet he intends to have at Sea this Summer, which as we are told will confile of 36 Men-of War. He likewife makes Levies by Land, intending to encrease his flanding Porces, because his Neighbours augment theirs. The Dukes of Lunenburg do also raife Men, but it is onby to recruit the Regiments they have already on Foot. It is reported, That the Poles have refolveds in the Dyet that is now affembled at Warfaw, to raife 20000 Horfe, for the fervice of the Emperor against the Turks, but our last Polish Letters not making any montion thereof, we know not what credit to give to it. From East Frizeland we have an account, That the Imperial Troops, who made an Attempt upon Uredembeurg, being difappointed in it by Major Linte.o's drawing sugether the Militia of the Country, are returned to their Quarters, and that endeavours are using to compole the differences between the Princess and States of that Country, which there is the more reason to believe may be successful, for that both fides grow sensible of the troubles they may otherwife bring upon themselves.

Paris, March 3. The King, the Queen, and the whole Court part to morrow as we told you in our laft, for Compeigne, and we are informed. That the Mareschal de Bellefonds, and the Mareschal de L'Orge, are gone before. It is fill faid, That there will be a great Encampment on the Soane, and that the Dauphin is to command the Army, and the Marcfchal de Schomberg under him; and it is report d. That there will be other Encompments belides this, but without any certainty. On Monday last the Doctors of the Sorbonne met to confider of the Proposition they received from the Parliament, concerning the Popes Authority, and after fome debate adjourned, the farther confideration thereof till Monday next. Four or five of the principal Streets of this City are going to be enlarged, and to be made more beautiful and commodious.

Whitehal, Feb. 28, This day the Right Honourable, Theophilm Earl of Humington, and Henry Earl of Peterborongh, were Sworn of His Majestics most Honourable Privy Council, and accordingly took their places at the Board.

Trinity-Houge, Febr. 28. The Candle Light at Winterton, belonging to the Corporation of Trinity-, Houle, by Extreamity of Weather, and breaking in of the Sca, being like to be malbed down, there was a necefity of its removal, which has been done fo far Southerly, in the fame Bearing, that it does not open fo well with the great Light: These are therefore to give notice thereof to all Maflers of Ships, and others concerned, and that care will be taken with ell convenient speed to place it more Northerly.
