goods, wates, and merchandise when imported or [exported from the said Kingdom of Hanover, in Hanoverian vessels; and that British vessels are charged with no other or higher tonnage duties on their entrance into the ports of the Kingdom of Hanover, than are levied on Hanoverian vessels; His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Acts' above recited; and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the first of this instant May, Hanoverian vessels entering or departing from the ports of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, together with the cargoes on board the same, such cargoes consisting of articles which may be legally imported or exported, shall not be subject to any other or higher duties or charges whatever than are or shall be levied on British vessels entering or departing from such ports, or on similar articles when imported into or exported from such ports in British vessels; and also that such articles when exported from the said ports in Hanoverian vessels, shall be entitled to the same bounties, drawbacks, and allowances, that are granted on similar articles when exported in British vessels:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
