The Freuch are making gieat provifion at Maubeuge.
Hegue, March 9. Yifterday the Heer Heinfus, whom the States General do f. nd in quality of ueir Envoy Extraordinary to the Molt Chrillian King, parted from hence for Brufels, from whence be will continue his Journey for France. The States of Holland do meet again to morrow, and the Prince of Orange is expected here from Dieyen the latter and of this Week. It has, as we are tol.!, been prepord in the Alfembly of the States General, to raire 15000 Men , and to encorporate them in the Regiments that are now on Foct, or to form them into new Bodies, as thall be thought moft expedient; but nothinf can be doue her ein till the lame Jias been relolved by the States of the Particular Proriuces. The Forcifications that are making at Breda, Grave, and Naerden, are veiy much hallened : Those at Breda arc almoft perfected, and at Naerden they are likewife very uell advancect, and in a polture to cover Holland on that fide, and the States have Cent Commilioners, with an Ingenier, to fee in what forwardnefs thefe that are makugat Grave are in.

Paris, Marchio. Before the Departure of the Court for Compiegne, which was on Thuriday, a great Council was held at Verfailies, after which Eviral Expreffes were difparched to dificrent plaes. However it is ftill foid that their Majeftics will ftay but eight days at Compiegne, and as many at Filliers Cotrez, and fo return to Verfalles. We are told, That 2 very grcat Mapazine is providing at Dinant, and that Monfieur $d=$ Ahontal bas been ehere to give orders about it. The King has appointed a Eond of ten Mithons of Livres for his Buildirgs this Year, of which three are to be employed at Cbambor, two at Verfailles, and fire at Sta Germatns, out of which lall fomething will be
allowed for Fontainbleau. Madam de Car:gyai has perented a petition to the Parliament tor the annulling the Marriage of the Count de Soiffons, her Grand-son.
