AT the Court at *Carlton-House*, the 25th of May 1824,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fourth year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to authorise His Majesty, under certain circumstances, to regulate the duties and drawbacks on goods imported or exported in foreign vessels, and to exempt certain foreign vessels from pilotage," His Majesty is authorised, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, or by His Majesty's Order or Orders in Council, to be published from time to time in the *London Gazette*, to authorise the importation into or exportation from the United Kingdom, or from any other of His Majesty's dominions, of any goods, wares, or merchandise, which may be legally imported or exported in foreign vessels, upon payment of such and the like duties only, and with the like drawbacks, bounties, and allowances, as are charged or granted upon similar goods, wares, or merchandise, when imported or exported in British vessels; provided always, that before any such Order or Orders shall be issued, satisfactory proof shall have been laid before His Majesty and His Privy Council, that goods, wares, and merchandise, imported into or exported from the foreign country in whose favour such remission of duties, or such drawbacks, bounties, or allowances, shall be granted, are charged with the same duties, and are allowed the same drawbacks, bounties, or allowances, when imported into or exported from such foreign country in British vessels, as are levied or allowed on similar goods, wares, and merchandise, when imported or exported in vessels of such country: And whereas by an Act, passed in the present session of Parliament, intituled

"An Act to indemnify all persons concerned in advising, issuing, or acting, under a certain Order in Council for regulating the tonnage duties on certain foreign vessels; and to amend an Act of the last session of Parliament, for authorising His Majesty, under certain circumstances, to regulate the duties and drawbacks on goods imported or exported in any foreign vessels," His Majesty is authorised (in certain cases), by and with the advice of His Privy Council, or by His Majesty's Order or Orders in Council, to be published from time to time in the *London Gazette*, to permit and authorise the entry into any port or ports of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or of any other of His Majesty's dominions, of any foreign vessels, upon payment of such and the like duties of tonnage only as are or may be charged or granted upon or in respect of British vessels: And whereas by a Convention, bearing date the second day of April last, His Majesty the King of Prussia has engaged that, from and after the first day of May then next ensuing, British vessels and their cargoes entering or departing from the ports of Prussia shall be placed on the same footing as Prussian vessels, in respect of the articles permitted to be imported or exported, and of the duties, bounties, drawbacks, and allowances, on such British vessels and cargoes; His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Acts above recited, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the first of this instant May, Prussian vessels entering or departing from the ports of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, shall not be subject to any other or higher duties or charges whatever than are or shall be levied on British vessels entering or departing from such ports. That all articles of the growth, produce, or manufacture, of any of the dominions of His Prussian Majesty, which are or shall be permitted to be imported into or ex-

ported from the ports of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland in British vessels, shall, in like manner, be permitted to be imported into and exported from the said ports in Prussian vessels: That all articles not of the growth, produce, or manufacture, of the dominions of His Prussian Majesty, which can legally be imported from Prussia into the ports of the United Kingdom in Prussian vessels, shall be subject only to the same duties as are payable upon the like articles if imported in British ships: That all goods, wares, and merchandise, which can legally be imported into the ports of the United Kingdom, shall be admitted at the same rate of duty when imported in Prussian vessels that is charged on similar articles imported in British vessels; and that all goods, wares, or merchandize, which can be legally exported from the ports of the United Kingdom shall be entitled to the same bounties, drawbacks, and allowances, when exported in Prussian vessels that are granted, paid, or allowed, on similar articles when exported in British vessels.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed money for the payment of half-pay to Sea Officers, from the 1st of April to the 30th of June last, according to His Majesty's establishment in that behalf; these are to give notice, that the several payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office, by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, at ten o'clock in the morning, on the following days, viz.

On the 2d, 3d, and 4th of August, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies.

On the 5th, 6th, 9th, 10th, and 11th of August, to Lieutenants and Chaplains, and their Attornies.

On the 12th and 13th of August, to Masters, Surgeons, and Purser, and their Attornies.

After which the lists will be recalled the first and third Wednesday in every month, that all persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them, and bring with them an affidavit as required by Order in Council of 30th July 1819, the forms of which were published in an advertisement from this Office, dated 16th September 1819, and may be procured at the Office of the Treasurer of the Navy; and in case any of the said Officers should not be able to attend themselves, but employ Attornies for that purpose, the said Attornies are to produce similar affidavits from the persons they are employed by.

Where Officers are abroad on leave, their agents are to produce attested copies of such leave, before the half-pay can be paid.

And as by Act of Parliament, passed in the thirty-fifth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious method for the payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the twentieth clause of the said Act, "that if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive half-pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near the place of his residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, in London, to have such half-pay paid at or near the place of his residence, &c. in the manner pointed out by the said Act;" and by a further Act, passed in the fifty-sixth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for enabling the Officers in His Majesty's Navy, and their representatives, to draw for and receive their half-pay," it is enacted by the first and third clauses of the said Act, "that if any Officer in His Majesty's Navy, who shall be entitled to receive any sum of money for or on account of his half-pay, shall be desirous of drawing a bill of exchange for the same upon the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy, instead of receiving the same by remittance bill, he shall signify such desire, by letter, to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy; and that if any Officer in His Majesty's Navy, who shall be entitled to receive any sum of money for or on account of half-pay, shall be desirous of having his half-pay paid to him by extract at any of

"His Majesty's Dock-Yards where Clerks for the payment of wages for the Navy shall reside, instead of receiving the same by remittance bill or bill of exchange, he is to apply either to the proper Clerk, at the Navy Pay-Office, in London; or at the Pay-Office at such Dock-Yard, signifying such his desire;" notice is hereby further given, that the half-pay ending the 30th of June 1824, will commence paying on the 2d of August; and all persons desirous of drawing for or of having their half-pay remitted to them, may apply as above directed. *G. MEM.—Bills of exchange drawn under or by virtue of the Act above recited, are not liable to the stamp duty.

No persons residing out of His Majesty's dominions are entitled to the privileges of this Act; any bill, therefore, which is drawn or negotiated abroad, will be neither accepted nor paid.

NEW LIGHTS ON THE COAST OF IRELAND.

THE Corporation for preserving and improving the port of Dublin, &c. give notice, that the undermentioned light stations will be illuminated, for the first time, on Wednesday 1st of September next, and will continue to be lit in future from sun-set to sun-rise.

Coningbeg Floating Light Ship, situate off the coast of Wexford; it bears by compass S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. from the great Saltee Island, distant $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles, 22 miles from Tusker Rock, W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. from Coningbeg to Hook Tower, N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 14 miles.

The vessel is fitted with three masts, on two of which lights will be hoisted.

Kilkadraan Light House, situate on the North side of the River Shannon, 8 miles within Loop Head; it bears from Kerry Head N. E. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. distant $12\frac{1}{2}$ miles, and from Dunmore Head E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. distant 7 miles.

This light will be steady, of a deep red colour towards the sea, and to the interior of the River Shannon a bright light.

Carlingford Light House, placed on the Haulbowling Rock, at the entrance of Carlingford Lough, off the coast of the county of Down; vessels approaching this harbour from the Northward, and giving the South Rock a birth of 2 miles, also Hellyhunter a birth of 2 miles, the course will be W. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. until they bring this light house N. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. in passing give it a birth of half a cable's length; Hellyhunter, on which a flag buoy will be placed, is distant from the South Rock 31 miles.

The old light on Cranfield Point, is to be discontinued, and the building removed, when Carlingford Light commences.
