百HE King of spain has refolved to have ${ }_{25}$ Gallcys in the Mediterramean this Summer, ( with which the Republick of Genoua are to joyn ten more) and to have likewife a confiderable Fleet of Men of War at Sea, which is to be Comman. ded by the Marquils d' Aquilar, late Vice-Roy of Valcnia, as General of the Sea, and under him by Count Herman Nunes, as Lieurenant-General, and the latter has Orders to repair forthwith to Cadix, to hatten the fitting out of this Royal Armada. We are cold, That a great Sum of Moncy has been lateiy remitted from heace to the Spanifh A mbalfador $2 t$ Vienna, part thereof being for the Emperor's Service, and part for the Levies that are making in-the Hereditary Countreys for the Dutchy of MiLam. There are Levies likewife making in this Kingdom, both of Horfe and Foot.
Venice, Feb. 10. The 16th Inftant arrived here the Duke of Mintous, to partake of the Diyertifements of the Carnaval. Prince Alexander of $p_{\text {arma }}$ is recovered of his illnefs, and has made his Vifits to the Procarators of St. Mark. The Duke of Parma has written a Letter to this Senate, to thank them for the Choice they have made of the faid Prince to be General of their Foot. From ,Rome of the 13 th Infant they write. That the lope had made choice of Signior Ranucci, Bilhup of Fano, formerly Nuncio at Turin, and in Poland, to catry the Bleft Clouts to the Duke of Burgundy. From Conflantizople we are told, That the GrandSignior had commanded the Mufti to fullow him into the Field, and that the Ottoman Troops were on their March from all parts of that Empiretowards Hungary. From Naples we have Letters of the ninth inftant, which tell us, That the Regiment of the Marquifs re Grottolo, confifting of 1000 Men, and eight Troops of difmounted Cavalry, were Embarked on three Merchant Ships, who were tocarry them to Geroua, or fome other con-s venient Port, from whence they might March for Milan, and that the Viceroy of Naples had fent Bills for 20000 Crowns to the Governor of Milas, to mount the faid Troops.

Genous. Murch 3. The 25th Inftant arrived here the william and Mrary, Captain Allen Commander, having on Board 400 Soldiers, and two other thips, a Genoueze and a Spaniard, with 1200 Mcn more, all fromr Naples: They have Landed themat Reces, 15 Miles to the Eaftward of this place, from whence they are Marched to Milan. The firf Infant came in here the Sea-Flower Captain Smith, from New. England. Ln Pogt are the leghorne Mercbant bound for Leghorne, the Rebecfa for Lisboz, and the succers for Galippoli.

Viemna, Feb. 28. We have advice from Kuag ary That count Teckeley, purfuant to his late Declaration, Thar he would employ his Medration at the Port, in orjer to the diverting the War with the rurks, has difpatched four D-puties to Adrianople. where the Grand-Signior now is, and many begin to bilieve, That Count Teckeley does i:m gund carneft labour fur Peace, thinking this the molt favourable conjuncture he can bave to obtain his own Terms of the Emperor, and to eltablifh himfelf and his Family. Buc whether his Interpofition. fuppofing it to be real, will be fo far confide 'd by the Turks, as that th.y will be thereby induced to change the mealures, for the executio. whereof th: y have made fuch valt Preparacions, is a qusftion that time: only can determine. There are Letters from the Count de Caprara, the Emperor's Minilter at the Port, which give an accoulor, 1 hat he arrived at Adrianople on the 18 ch of Defembets. That he was expecting an Audience of the Grand Signior; That the Preparations of the Turks are very great, and that nothing but a War is to be expeeted; and with this our other adv'ces do agrec', and particularly they continue to write fromGreicks Weifenbourg, That the Ottoman Troops arrive daily in thofe parts, That valt Magazincs are providing, and that a great many fmall Boats or Vetect are building, to be cmployed on the Danube. Chanccllor Hocker, after a loug Sigknefs, died bere this day, and ic's faid, That the siewr Siractman; one of the Emperor's Ambaffadors at the Confirence at Francfort, who arrived here two or three days agone from Ratibbonre, will fucceed him. A he Turks, in the laft attempt they made upon the IOAns Sobuts, took many of the Country People Prifoners, which they carried with them to Newbeufl.

Cologae, March g. The Emperor having bern ins formed of the'diforders which have of latedifurb:d chis City, has fent an Imprial Mardate to th Magitrates and the Burghersy Not to move any fars ther the matters in coatroverfio between theat but to les them remain in the fate they now ary in, till his Imperial Majefty (hall have decermincí thom, which he intends very fpeedify to do, for the preferving the publick Peace of this City, and proventing the eroubles that thefs \&ifferences may ub therwife lead them into.
