The King has been pleased to direct letters patent to be passed under the Great Seal, granting the dignity of a Baron of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland to the Right Honourable Percy Clinton Sydney, Viscount Strangford, His Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at the Sublime Ottoman Porte, and the heirs male of his body, lawfully begotten, by the name, stile, and title of Baron Strangford, of Clontarf, in the county of Dublin.

The King has been pleased to give and grant unto the Right Honourable George Robert Earl of Buckinghamshire, his royal lincence and authority, that in compliance with a condition and injunction contained in the last will and testament of John Hampden, sometime of the parish of St. George, Hanover-square, in the county of Middlesex, and of Great Hampden, in the county of Buckingham, Esq. deceased, he and his issue may assume and use the surname of Hampden only, and take the arms of Hampden, and bear and use the same quarterly in the first quarter with his paternal arms, such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office, otherwise His Majesty's said royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect: and moreover that the said Earl of Buckinghamshire and his issue male, to whom certain estates bequeathed in the said will shall descend, may write and subscribe the said surname of Hampden before and immediately preceding all titles of honour:
