NOTICE is hereby given, to all persons whom it may concern, that application will be made in the next session of Parliament by the Governors and Directors of the poor and watch of the united parishes of Saint Andrew, Holborn, above the Bars, and Saint George the Martyr, in the county of Middlesex, for leave to bring in a Bill to extend, alter and amend an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter 41, intitled "An Act for better regulating and employing the poor, and for more effectually watching the squares, streets, lanes and other places within that part of the parish of Saint Andrew, Holborn, which lies above the Bars, in the county of Middlesex, and the parish of Saint George, the Martyr, in the said county," so far as the same has been found defective and insufficient for the general purposes thereof, particularly as far as regards the settling and ascertaining the sums to be raised for the relief of the poor, and the assessing, collecting and recovering the rates and the payment thereof, as well by occupiers as by landlords and owners, and the levying the same, and the duties of the collectors thereof, and as to the appointment of overseers of the poor; and also to vest in the Governors and Directors of the poor of the said united parishes, for the time being, the power of appointing a sufficient number of constables and headboroughs for the said parishes, and persons to examine weights and measures therein, with proper authorities for the discharge of those duties, which power and authorities are now exercised by the Court Leet of our Lord the King, held in and for the manor of Portpool, and otherwise to extend, amend and enlarge the powers of the said Act as far as shall be found necessary for carrying the objects thereof into execution.—Dated this 18th day of October 1824.
