WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fourth VV year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to authorise His Majesty, under certain " circumstances, to regulate the duties and draw-" backs on goods imported or exported in foreign " vessels, and to exempt certain foreign vessels " from pilotage," His Majesty is authorised, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, or by His Majesty's Order or Orders in Council, to be published from time to time in the London Gazette, to authorise the importation into or exportation from the United Kingdom, or from any other of His Majesty's dominions, of any goods, wares, or merchandise which may be legally imported or exported in foreign vessels, upon payment of such and the like duties only, and with the like drawbacks, hounties, and allowances as are charged or granted upon similar goods, wares, or merchandise when imported or exported in British vessels; provided always, that before any such Order or Orders shall be issued, satisfactory proof shall have been laid before His Majesty and His Privy Council, that goods, wares, and merchandise imported into or exported from the foreign country in whose tavour such remission of duties, or such drawbacks, bounties, or allowances shall be granted, are charged with the same duties, and are allowed the same drawbacks, bounties, or allowances when imported into or exported from such foreign country in British vessels, as are levied or allowed on similar goods, wares, and merchandise when imported or exported in vessels of such country: And whereas by an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled " An Act to indemnify all persons con-

" cerned in advising, issuing, or acting under a " certain Order in Council, for regulating the " tonnage duties on certain foreign vessels; and " to amend an Act of the last session of Parliament, for authorising His Majesty, under certain circumstances, to regulate the duties and " drawbacks on goods imported or exported in any foreign vessels," His Majesty is authorised (in certain cases), by and with the advice of His Privy Council, or by His Majesty's Order or Orders in Council, to be published from time to time in the London Gazette, to permit and authorise the entry into any port or ports of the United King-dom of Great Britain and Ireland, or of any other of His Majesty's dominions, of any foreign vessels, upon payment of such and the like duties of tonnage only as are or may be charged or granted upon or in respect of British vessels: And whereas satisfactory proof has been laid before His Ma-jesty and His Privy Conncil, that goods, wares, and merchandise imported into or exported from the ports of His Serene Highness the Duke of Oldenburgh, are charged with the same duties, and are allowed the same drawbacks, bounties, or allowances when imported or exported in British vessels as are levied or allowed on similar goods, wares, and merchandise when imported into or etported from the said ports in Oldenburgh vessels ; and that British vessels are charged with no other or higher tonnage duties on their entrance into the ports of Oldenburgh, than are levied on Oldenburgh vessels; His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Acts above recited, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the date of this Order, Oldenburgh vessels entering the ports of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, in ballast or laden, direct from any of the ports of Oldenburgh, or departing from the ports of the said United Kingdom, together with the cargoes on board the same,

such cargoes consisting of articles which may be legally imported or exported, shall not be subject to any other or higher duties or charges whatever than are or shall be levied on British vessels entering or departing from such ports, or on similar articles when imported into or exported from such ports in British vessels; and also that such articles when exported from the said ports in Oldenburgh vessels, shall be entitled to the same bounties, drawbacks, and allowances, that are granted on similar articles when exported in British vessels:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

His Majesty is autho-rised, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, or by any Order or Orders in Council, in all cases in which British vessels, of less burthen than sixty tons, are not required by law to take pilots, to exempt foreign vessels, being of less burthen than sixty tons, from taking on board a pilot to conduct them into or from any of the ports of the United Kingdom, any law, custom, or usage to the con-trary notwithstanding; His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in him by the said Act, and by and with the advice of His Privy Conneil, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the date of this Order, all vessels belonging to the inhabitants of Bremen, and being of less burthen than sixty tons, which shall enter in or clear out from any of the ports of the United Kingdom, shall be, and they are hereby exempted from taking on board a pilot to conduct them into or from any such port, in all cases where British vessels, being of less burthen than sixty tons, are not required by law to take pilots, any law, custom, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding :

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

HEREAS the time limited by His Ma jesty's Order in Council, of the tenth of March last, for prohibiting the exportation of gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar), will expire on the nineteenth day of September next; and whereas it is judged expedient that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer, His-Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnancefor His Majesty's Service), do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the nineteenth of September next), presume to transport any. gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or aminunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar) or ship or lade any guapowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammu-. nition, on board any ship or vessel, in order totransporting the same into any such ports or places. on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf, first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respectiveforfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passedin the twenty-ninth year of the reign of His Ma-jesty King George the Second, intituled "An Act. to empower His Majesty to prohibit the expor-66 tation of gun-powder, or any sort of arms or. " ammunition, and also to empower His Majesty " to restrain the carrying coastwise of salt-petre; gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammuni-"tion;" and also by an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of His late Majesty's reign, cap. 2, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to. " restrain the exportation of naval stores, and "more effectually to prevent the exportation of "salt-petre, arms, and ammunition, when prohi-"bited by Proclamation or Order in Council:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden ofr the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. And it hath also been humbly represented unto the King, that, on Tuesday the 2d day of November instant, the body of Mary Ann Hattenborough, a girl of the age of eight years (who had been missing for eight days), was found in a pond adjoining Maud Foster's Drain, in Boston aforesaid; and that there is strong reason to believe, that the said Mary Ann Hattenborough was murdered, previously to her being thrown into the said pond;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the person or persons concerned in each of the above atrocious murders, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person or persons who actually committed either of the said murders) who shall discover his accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
