REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE KING'S LEVEE AT CARLTON-HOUSE.

And those Gentlemen who are to be presented are hereby informed it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Gentleman who is to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's-Office, on Tuesday the 19th instant, before twelve o'clock, in order that they may be submitted for the King's approbation, it being His Majesty's command, that no presentations at the Levee shall hereafter be made but in conformity with the above regulations.

The State Apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court until one o'clock.
