No Lady can be received by His Majesty at the Drawing-Room, but in conformity to the above regulations.

The State Apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court until one o'clock.

Westminster, May 2, 1825.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act to extend the provisions of an Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty, concerning the disposition of certain real and personal property of His Majesty, his heirs, and successors.

An Act to amend the laws relating to bankrupts.

An Act to make further provision for the payment of the crews of His Majesty's ships and vessels.

An Act for the amendment of the law as to the offence of sending threatening letters.

An Act for fixing until the twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, the rates of subsistence to be paid to keepers and others on quartering soldiers.

An Act to repeal certain parts of, and to alter and amend an Act, passed in the forty-seventh year of the reign of His late Majesty, King George the Third, to authorise the trustees of the River Weaver Navigation to open a more convenient communication between the said river near Frodsham-bridge and the river Mersey, near Westpoint, in the township of Weston, in the county of Chester, and to amend two Acts relative to the said river.

An Act for making and maintaining a railway or tram-road from the Cromford Canal, at or near to Cromford, in the parish of Wirksworth, in the county of Derby, to the Peak Forest Canal, at or near to Whaley (otherwise Yardsley-cum-Whaley), in the county palatine of Chester.

An Act to enable the Vauxhall-bridge Company to raise a further sum of money, and to alter and amend the Acts relating to the said bridge.

An Act for making and maintaining a turnpike-road from Wakefield to join the Shepley-lane-head turnpike-road, in Denby-dale, in the parish of Penistone with certain branches, all in the west riding of the county of York.

An Act for more effectually repairing the roads from the Gloucester Hotel, in the town of Bright-helmstone, through the towns of Cuckfield and Crawley to the County Oak on Lovell-Heath, and certain other roads therein mentioned; and also for making and maintaining a branch of road from Austy-Cross, in the parish of Cuckfield to West Grinstead, all in the county of Sussex.
