£5 PER CENT. 1797.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the 37th year of the reign of His late Majesty, cap. 10, intituled "An Act for raising eighteen millions by way of annuities," it was, amongst other things, provided, that the several principal sums in annuities, after the rate of £5 per centum per annum, created by the said Act, should be paid off, redeemed, and fully discharged by Parliament, at the expiration of three years from the period at which the joint stock of annuities, created by certain Acts of the 24th, 25th, 34th, 35th, and 36th years of His late Majesty's reign, should actually have been redeemed or paid off, or the interest or dividends therein should have been redeemed in pursuance of the Act of the 25th year of His late Majesty's reign; and it was also further provided, that whenever the said annuities at the rate of £5 per cent. thereby granted should become redeemable, it should be lawful for the respective contributors, his, her, or their executors, administrators, successors, or assigns, to elect to have the same paid off in ready money, or at his, her, or their election to have the principal sums in such annuities converted into other annuities at the rate of £3 per centum per annum; in which case, every contributor, his, her, or their executors, administrators, successors, or assigns should for every £100 of the principal sum in annuities after the rate of £5 per centum as aforesaid, be entitled to the principal sum of £133 6s. 8d. in Consolidated Annuities after the rate of £3 per centum per annum:

And whereas the said annuities at the rate of £5 per centum per annum, created by certain Acts of the 24th, 25th, 34th, 35th, and 36th years of His late Majesty's reign, were redeemed or paid off on the 5th day of July 1822:

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that the proprietors of the said £5 per cent. annuities, created by the said Act of the 37th year of His late Majesty's reign, will, on the 5th day of July 1825, receive payment of the same in money, or their said annuities will be converted into an equivalent amount of £3 per Cent. Consolidated Annuities, in conformity to the provisions of the said Act; and all such proprietors are requested to notify to the Governor and Company of the Bank of England their election, whether they desire to receive money, or to have an equivalent of £3 per Cent. Consolidated Annuities.
