OUrietters from warfaw of the 26th palt tril us, I hat a Turkilh Chiaus was arsived there, and had had Audience of the Marefchal of the Crown, and that he had, in the name of the Grand-Sigrior, demanded a free Pafface for 50000 Tarcars, through the Polifh Ter. situries, to Silcfat : and that the Ambaffadors of the Duke of Cuurland had at loft obtained the Invefture of that Durchy, upon this condition, That what has been now dene thall not be drawn into Prefilent, but that for the future the Duke of Courland lhall come in Perfon to defire the 1 n velture.

Genoua, March 3 x . Yefterday Morning arrived here the Indufry, Capcain Croford, from Alicant and Majorca. Several Dutcb and French Ships are lik=wife arrived here fince our laft.

Vienna, April i. They write from upper Huxgary, That the Turks will be very eally in the Field ; That they have Pofted 15000 Men n' ar the Bridge of Efeg, to maintain that palfage into the Lower Hurgary, which is of great importance: The Margrave of Baden is gone to Raab and CO- : morra, to vifit thofe places, and to fee they be provided with all things necellary for their defence. The Rebels have had a defign to make an Incurfon into Silefa, and to prevent them, the Emperne has ent thither Lieutenant-General Sclutz. This week arrived here two Hungarian Gentlemen; who came to reprefent to the Emperor the great danger the Iffe of scbutz is in, the Turks being refolved to revenge the Difgrace they fuffered in their lalt attempt, and the Imperial Troops that are Quartered there not being fufficient to fecure the faid Inand, whereupon the Emperor has erdered more Troops to March thither. Count TeckeIey's Secretay, who has been fortic time here, is at laft gone home, and in his Company the Baron de Saponara is again difpatched to Count Teckeley, who is at prefent at Mongatz, to make new Overtures to him, and withal to let him know, That this is the laft offer that will be made him of his Imporial Majefties Grace and Pardon. We are every day expecting to hear from Warfaxy of the Conclufion of the Offenfive and Defenfive Alliance between the Emperor and that Crown againit the Turks, in confideration whereof the Emperor, as we are informed, quits the Pretentions he has upon the Poler on account of the 300dos Crowns which they promiled the Emperor for bis affiftance in their laft War againft the Suedes, and which were affigned upon the Salt, but were never paid, and pelinquilhes the yearly pention they are obliged to Pay the Queen Dowager of Poland, Wife to the Duke of Lorrein, and befides is to pay them prefently 200000 Crowns,

- Vienna, "April $3_{3}$. The Rendezvous of the Imperial Troops in surgery is fixed for the 'oth of this month, and the Emperor continues his refolution of being prefent at it: It is faid that the Elector of Bduaria will be fhortly here, and that be will accompany his Imperial Majefty to the faid Rendezvous. and at the fame time this difcourfe is reacwed of his Electoral Higlineffes Marrying with the Archdutchefg the Emperour's Daughter. The Duke of Lorrain is expected here the ninth or tenth of this month, and in the mcan time hischief Minifter Monfieur Canoa does adjult all Matters with relation to his Highneffes commanding the Imperial Army. The Yalatin of elungar) is fill here, folliciting the payment of 400000 Florins, which he is to receive for the raifing sooo Hurgarian Horle, that are to be joyned to the Imperial Army, to whib are likewife to be added $\$ 000$ Men, which the States of the Lower Hungary hare promifed to rale and mainrain upon their own Cha'ge. The Emperor has Publilhed the Arrierban in Upper Efurga. $r$, with this condition, That thofe who are urrwilling to come int) the Field them(elres, thall, inltead therenf, pay fo much Money to the Palatine of Hungary. The Letters twe receive from Hungtry tell us, That the Vizier of offen bas appointed a Rendezvous of all the Troops under his Command, on St. George's Day; That Count Teckeleg has premifed to bring Twenty Thousind Men inno the Ficid, and that the Troops of Tranfivanid, Walachis, and Moldavix, and the Tartars, arc to act againft the Poles. They write from warf 10 , That the term for the fitting of the Dyce was again prolonged for fix days, and that the Alliance between the Emperor and that Crown was not yet Concluded.
Retibonve, April 3. On the 30 th palt the DireElors of the Colledge of the Princes reported the Anfwer of the Electoral Colledge to their laft Declaration, the fubflance of which was, Tbat the Eleftordl Colledge did perfof in tbeir Conchrfon of the 12 of December, and tbar tbough they pere sot obliged to give any acceant of the reafors theqt moved then thereunto, yet tbey were willing to declare, That tbe confferation of ibe Safety of the Emfire, wobich would be expofed to entevitable danger if a firm Peace was not effabitfod with the Moft Cbrifiazs Rithg, bad'robliged them to tuke and to minitain tbis Refofiution. The Colledge of the Princes having delibertuced here: upon, have likewife refolved to adhere to their former Conclufions.
strasburg', Aptil 9 . The Marquifs de Cbamizily, our Governor; is expected here very fuddenly, feveral of his Servants Being already arrived. The Barofi de Moxclar is going to make a turn in the Upper' Alface, and in the mean time the Troops that are to draw together; and to EnEamp near Lanian; will have Orders to March thither. The ways befween Lorraik and Aljaee are scpairing, and there
is a teport that the Mof Clunian King will cume into thefe pares this Su.nimer.

Cologne, Aprif 13 . Tbings continue here in great diforder, and tefteitlay a grear number of per ple got togivher beforcehe Town. Houle, and demanded of the Magiftrates the Execution of what had been ordered againft feverat Otticers of this City. The Emperor has lately written a Letter to the Elector of Mentz, wherein he complains of the Declaration which the Colledge of Electors affembled at Ratisbonne, (of which the Elećtor of Mentz is Director) have made of their acc. pting the French Propoials. againdt the Proteltations of the Electors of Bavatia and Saxony, and without the Concurrence of the Collegiges of the Frinces and the Imperial Towns, and the Approbation of tipe Imperial Commifioner, which are all effentially necelfary, and ought the rather to have been had in this maccer, becaufe of the great weight and importance of it, and therefore reguires his Elçetoual Highnefs fo to order things as that they may proceed more regularly for the future.

Hamburg, April 13. Weage now every day expecting to lear of the King of Denmark's arrival at Gluck fladt; He has apponated a Rendezyous of his Troops at Coldengen, and will be himflif prefent at it. The Dukes of Lunenburg do Mufter their Troops, and it's faid they have Orders to March towards the Elbem The Elector of Brandenburg is I moved, with his Gourt, from Berlin fo - Puldarn, and his Officers uf grear diligence in their new Levies. The Polith Letters cell, ws, That Count Morftein, the Crown-Treafurery who is accufed in tie Dyet of holding Correfpondence with the Ftench, had been perfuaded by his Friends to refign all his publick Employments, which he had accordingly done; but it needs a Confirmation.

Brugèls, April i2. An Sunday lalt arrived here an extraordinary Courier from Spain, and foon after Expreffes were difpatched from hence to Vi enna and the Hague, and the lalt night a Gentleman, whom the Prinçe of Orange lately fent hither, parted from heace for Dieren, where his Highners at prefent is ; By this Spanifh Courier the Marquil's de Granz received, as we ape informed. Bills of Exchange for a very confinctable Sum of Money. This Morning Count Taff, and the young, Prince d'Axemberg, parted from bepce for Gexmany, bis Excellency lending them his own Conches, as far as Cologne, Erom Lille they write, That the Ficach will bave two Camps in the new Eonquelts, the one near Menin, commanded by Monfiecur de Soure dis, and the other at Mabeuge by Monlieur de Montbrop; That, befides thefe there will be feveral ather Camps, ast in qiface commanded by Monfieur de Mouclat, on the Suar by the Duke de Villerey, on the Soane by Menficur de Boufters, E'c. and that the King has declared the Dauphin Generaliflimp of all his Eorces; There Letterssadd, Thate the Marefcbah d'Eumiexes is daily expecteqd at, Lille, and that the French Trqops in the new conquelts aro changing Quarters and that molt of the Infantry have Orders to March towards the suar, pthers, being to come in their room,

Brufels, Aprit 16 . The Viadore General has been very frict in Mufering the-feveral, Garifons of Flandorss from whence he is kately returned, and has cabiered feveral Oficecti, who had not the number of Men they ought fohave had. Ifon fume difierencs between the-Prince ife $V$ audemonis and, the Duke of

Erave, the latter feat the Prince a Challenge yeibcrday, which his Excekncy having notice of, he Cauled the Duke of Eavre to be fecuid. The Letters from Germany tell us that the Cifles of Baviria, Franconia, Suabia, and the $V$ pper fbine, are entring into a common League, by virtue of which they are to bring soo00 Men inte the-lield for the defence and fecurity of the Empire, ifthere fhall be occafiun, befides 20000 which the Elector of Ba varia is, as they fay, to furnifh. From Liege they write, That there appears at prefent a great difpofition to a Compofure, and that they doubted not but the Archdeacon of Liege, whom the Chapter fent the laft Weck to Cologne, will make a great fep towards it.

Hlague, April 16. The Province of Gepterland has likewife coniented to the flate of whe War for this ycar. The 16 Ships which the States leve refolved to put to Sea, are fitting out with great diligence; it's not doubted but they are defigerd for the Affiflance of the Suedes, that they may not be bindred by the Danes, who will have a yery good Fleet at Sea, in the Tranfporeing the Tropps they intend to fend to their Territorics in Germany. The Heet Coliers, Ambalfador from this State at Conftantinople, being latcly dead, the States have appointed his Son, who is thers, to perform the Fundtion of their Ambaffador till farther order. The Actionsp of gur Eaff-India Company are very much fallen, - Paris, April ${ }^{1} 7$ Irgparations are making for the King's Journey ; if"s faid that the Queen and the Dauphiats, by rqafon of the latters being with Child, will ramain at Verfailues; and that the Dquphin, whom the King will declare Generalifimus of all his Armiss, will part fome days beffore the King ${ }^{3}$ Yelterday a Quarrel happened bere between the Marquifs de Guerchi, and fome other young Gentlemen, and feveral Soldiers, in which the Marquifs was killed, and his Brother, a Youth of about 13 years old, dangerpully wounded, after having killed three or four of the Soldiers.
