Then a commission for prorogning the Parliament was re.d.

· After which the Lord Chancellor said ;

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

By virtue of His Majesty's commission, under the Great Seal, to us and other Lords directed, and now read, we do, in His Majesty's name, and in obedience to his commands, prorogue this Parliament to Thursday the twenty-fifth day of August next, to be then here holden; and this Parliament is accordingly prorogued to Thursday the twentyfifth day of August next.
