Proposals must be made separately for each county and island, except for the counties comprising North and South Wales, all of which must be included in one tender; likewise the islands of Guernsey, Jersey, and Alderney; as also must the several counties in North Britain; and each proposal must have the letter which is annexed to the tender properly filled up by two persons of known property, engaging to become bound with the party tendering, in the amount stated in the printed particulars, for the due performance of the contract; and no proposal will be noticed unless made on a printed tender, and the prices expressed in words at length; and should it so happen that during the continuance of the contract no troops should be supplied by virtue of the same, the amount of the stamps on the contract and bond, paid in the first instance by the contractor, will be refunded to him.

Particulars of the contracts may be had upon application at this Office, between the hours of ten and four; and of the Barrack-Masters in the islands of Guernsey, Jersey, and Man; and as several alterations have been made in the printed particulars, which alterations are printed in italic, it is requested that persons making tenders will carefully attend to the same.
