

**W**HEREAS by a Decree of the High Court of Chancery, bearing date the 23d day of July 1825, made in three several Causes, in one of which Samuel Fereday and others are Plaintiffs, and James Adam and others are Defendants, in another of which the said Samuel Fereday and others are Plaintiffs, and William Legh and another are Defendants, and in the other of which the said William Legh and others are Plaintiffs, and Ann Wilkinson and others are Defendants, it is amongst other things referred to Samuel Compton Cox, Esq. one of the Masters of the said Court, to inquire and take an account what debts, charges, and incumbrances, are now owing by or chargeable upon the trust-estate, real or personal, of John Wilkinson, late of Castlehead, in the County of Lancaster, Ironmaster, deceased, the Testator in the pleadings in such Causes named (and who died in or about the month of July 1808), and the particulars and amounts thereof respectively, and in whom such debts, charges, and incumbrances are vested and their respective priorities.—Any person or persons therefore claiming any debt or debts, charges or incumbrances, to be due and owing by or chargeable upon the trust-estate, real or personal, of the said Testator, John Wilkinson, are, on or before the 10th day of November 1825, by their Solicitors, to come in before the said Master, at his Chambers, in Southampton-Buildings, Chancery-Lane, London, and lay before him such evidence as may be necessary for the purpose of shewing in whom such debts, charges or incumbrances are vested, together with the dates and particulars of any security or securities they may hold in respect of such debt or debts.

**P**URSUANT to a Decree of the High Court of Chancery, made in a Cause wherein Henry Trail and others are plaintiffs, and Elizabeth Burt Barr and others are defendants, the Creditors of John Barr, formerly of Calcutta, in the East Indies, afterwards of Charlotte-Street, Portland-Place, in the County of Middlesex, and lastly of Wellington-Place, near Glasgow, in North Britain, Esq. (who died on the 9th day of November 1820), are forthwith to come and prove their debts before Francis Paul Stratford, Esq. one of the Masters of the said Court, at his Chambers, in Southampton-Buildings, Chancery-Lane, London, or in default thereof they will be excluded the benefit of the said Decree.

**P**URSUANT to a Decree of the High Court of Chancery, made in a Cause Simpson against Ritson, the Creditors of John Whinnay, late of Papecastle, in the Parish of Bridekirk, in the County of Cumberland, Yeoman, deceased (who died in or about the month of April 1802), are, on or before the 7th day of November 1825, to come in before William Courtenay, Esq. one of the Masters of the said Court, at his Chambers, in Southampton-Buildings, Chancery-Lane, London, and prove their debts, or in default thereof they will be peremptorily excluded the benefit of the said Decree.

**P**URSUANT to a Decree of the High Court of Chancery, made in a Cause wherein Hannah Wilding is plaintiff, and Henry Lawson and others are defendants, the Creditors of Henry Wilding, late of Roan-Street, Greenwich, in the County of Kent, Gentleman, deceased (who died on or about the 30th day of April 1822), are forthwith to come in and prove their debts before James William Farrar, Esq. one of the Masters of the said Court, at his Chambers, in Southampton-Buildings, Chancery-Lane, London, or in default thereof they will be excluded the benefit of the said Decree.

**P**URSUANT to a Decree of the High Court of Chancery, made in a Cause wherein William Gibbard and Mary his wife are plaintiffs, and Edward Brafield and Ann his wife are defendants, the Creditors of John Stephens, late of Quebec-Street, in the Parish of St. Mary-la-Bonne, in the County of Middlesex, Undertaker (who died on or about the 27d day of February 1820), are, by their Solicitors, to come in and prove their debts before James Trower, Esq. one of the Masters of the said Court, at his Chambers, in Southampton-Buildings, Chancery-Lane, London, on or before the 10th day of November 1825, or in default thereof they will be peremptorily excluded the benefit of the said Decree.
