Copenhagen, April 7. He Suedish Minister here has prefented a Memorial to the King of Denmark, wherein he offers, as we are inform-ed, the King his Mafters Mediation for the composing the differences that do depend between his Majelly of Denmark and the Duke of Holftein, and acquaints him with the King of Suedens intention to transport fome Troops to his Territories in Germany, to re-inforce his Garilons there. The diligence that is used here in fitting out the Ships the King has re-folved to put to Sea, is very extraordinary, and part of them are almost ready to Sail.

Vienna, April 11. On Thursday last arrived here the Duke of Lorrain,, who went directly to the Palace to wait upon the Emperor, and the next day a Council of War was held, where, as we are informed, it was refolved, That the Imperial Army, which is to Rendezvous the third of the next Month near Presbourg, shall confist of 40000 Men; That General Schutz shall, with 7000 Men, joyn the 6000 Polinh Horfe, which the Chevalier Lubomirski brings into the Emperors Service, and the Hungarian Troops, which together may make a Body of 25000 Men, and thele are to act is upper Hungary; That another Body of 6000 Men shall Encamp near Leopolftadt on the Waag, and in case they find the Turks have a defign upon that place, they are to put themfelves into it. And befides thefe, ten or twelve thousand Men are to be Posted on the Frontiers of Moravia and Silesia, to fecure those Countreys against the Incursions of the Turks. From Hungary they write, That Count Teckeley makes great Preparations for the Campagne, and that he has fent to the Balla of Buda, to demand a Body of Horfe, to joyn with his Troops, in order to their making an Incursion into Silefia: The Letters add, That most of the Nobility of Upper Hungary are very much diffatisfied with him, and have refused to obey his Sum-mons for their following h m into the Field. There are Advices which give an account, That the Grand Signior is on his March towards Belgrade, and that an Army of Tartars is to Rendezvous the 25 Instant at Pest, not far from Buda.

Ratisbonne, April 12. The Point of the Publick Security being with great carnefinels recommended to the Dyct by the Imperial Commissioner the Bithop d'Aich/ladz, the Electoral Colledge did on Saturday last enter upon the Confideration of it; and after fome debate, declared. That for as much as the danger which the impending War with the Turks threatens, not only the Hereditary Countries, but even the whole Empire does encreale daily, they are of opinion that nothing is more carnelly to be

take flich Refolutions as may be farther necessary for the Publick Security; and that therefore they do adhere to their Conclusion of the 12th of December. At the fame time the Colledge of Princes have refolved, to return their molt humble Thanks to the Emperor for his Fatherly Care of the Common Safe-ty of the Empire, of which he gives daily Inflances in this difficult and dangerous Conjuncture; And that feeing the Partition of the Quota's of the Army of the Empire has been agreed by the feveral Circles, it is necessary to appoint the general Offia cers, and that accordingly they are of opinion that the Command of General of the Army of the Em-pire fhould be conferred on Prince Waldecke, a Per-ion of great Abilities and Experience in War; and that at the fame time that they diffact the Point of the Publick Scurity, they will do what lies in them to advance the Negotiation of Peace with the Crown of France. The Imperial Regiments that have had their Quarters in the Empire are now

marching for Hungary, Hamburg, April 23. The Letters from Copenha-gen tell us, That the King of Denmark has appoint. ed the Rendezvous of his Troops in Holftein, to be the fourth of May, at which he will be him-felf prefent. From *Stockbolm* they write, That, there was a difcourfe at that Courr, That the King of Sueden, to avoid giving his Neighbours any Jealoulie, would defer the transporting the Troops he defigns to fend over for Germany, till there be a prefling occasi n for it, and that in the mean time, he will raise 4000 Men in Germany, which he is to affift the Emperor with against the Turks. From Warfam they tell us, That there was arrived an Ambasfador from the Czar of Moscowy, but that the bulinels he came about was not yet known, though, fome reported that he had Orders to affure the King of Poland that the Czars defired to enter into an Alliance with him and the Emperor, for their mutual defence against the Turks.It's faid that by the League now concluded between the Emperor and the Crown of Poland, it is flipulated, That the Polifh Army shall act separately towards the Ukraine, but if Fienna or Cracsw shall be Bessed by the Turks, then the Imperial and Polifh Forces are to joyn together for their relief.

There are Letters from Rome which fay, That the Journey of the Bilhop of Fano, whom the Pape lends his Nuncio hither, is put off till after Whit-fontide.
