

jeſty has ſo repeatedly declared his determination to maintain; in order that none of His Maſteſty's ſubjects may unwarily render themſelves liable to the penalties impoſed by the Statute herein mentioned, has thought fit, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to iſſue this His Royal Proclamation :

And His Maſteſty does hereby ſtrictly command that no perſon or perſons whatſoever do preſume to take part in any of the ſaid conſtents, or to commit or attempt any act, matter, or thing whatſoever, contrary to the proviſions of the ſaid Statute, upon pain of the ſeveral penalties by the ſaid Statute impoſed, and of His Maſteſty's high diſpleaſure :

And His Maſteſty, by and with the advice aforeſaid, doth hereby enjoin all His Maſteſty's ſubjects ſtrictly to obſerve, as well towards the Ottoman Porte and the Greeks, as towards all other belligerents with whom His Maſteſty is at peace, the duties of neutrality; and to reſpect in all, and each of them, the exerciſe of thoſe belligerent rights, which His Maſteſty has always claimed to exerciſe, when His Maſteſty has himſelf been unhappily engaged in war.

Given at Our Court at Windſor, the thirtieth day of September one thouſand eight hundred and twenty-five, and in the ſixth year of Our reign.

WHEREAS an Act of Parliament was paſſed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of His late Maſteſty King George the Second, intituled " An Act to empower His Maſteſty to prohibit the exportation of ſalt-petre, and to enforce the law for empowering His Maſteſty to prohibit the exportation of gun-powder, or any ſort of arms and ammunition, and alſo to empower His Maſteſty to reſtrain the carrying coaſtwiſe of ſalt-petre, gun-powder, or any ſort of arms or ammunition;" and His Maſteſty judging it neceſſary to prohibit the exportation of cannon, mortars, howitzers, carronades, and all carriages and other appurtenances for the uſe of the ſame, and all cannon-balls, bombs, grenades, cannister-shot, Congreve rockets, Shrapnell or other ſhells, and appurtenances for the uſe of the ſame, out of this kingdom, for ſome time, doth therefore, with the advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no perſon or perſons whatſoever (except the Maſter-General of the Ordnance, or the Lords Commiſſioners of the Admiralty for His Maſteſty's Service) do, at any time during the ſpace of ſix months from the date of this Order in Council, preſume to transport into any parts out of this kingdom, any cannon, mortars,

howitzers, carronades, and all carriages and other appurtenances for the uſe of the ſame, and all cannon-balls, bombs, grenades, cannister-shot, Congreve rockets, Shrapnell or other ſhells, and appurtenances for the uſe of the ſame, or ſhip or lade any cannon, mortars, howitzers, carronades, and all carriages and other appurtenances for the uſe of the ſame, and all cannon-balls, bombs, grenades, cannister-shot, Congreve rockets, Shrapnell or other ſhells, and appurtenances for the uſe of the ſame, on board any ſhip or veſſel, in order to transporting the ſame into any parts beyond the ſeas, without leave or permiſſion in that behalf firſt obtained from His Maſteſty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and ſuffering the reſpective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by the afore-mentioned Act :

And the Lords Commiſſioners of His Maſteſty's Treasury, the Commiſſioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Maſter-General of the Ordnance, and His Maſteſty's Secretary at War, are to give the neceſſary directions herein as to them may reſpectively appertain.

WHEREAS the time limited by His Maſteſty's Order in Council, of the twenty-third of March laſt, for prohibiting the exportation of gun-powder or ſalt-petre, or any ſort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coaſt of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar), has expired; and whereas it is judged expedient that the ſaid prohibition ſhould be continued for ſome time longer, His Maſteſty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no perſon or perſons whatſoever (except the Maſter-General of the Ordnance for His Maſteſty's Service), do, at any time during the ſpace of ſix months (to commence from the date of this Order), preſume to transport any gun-powder or ſalt-petre, or any ſort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coaſt of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar) or ſhip or lade any gun-powder or ſalt-petre, or any ſort of arms or ammunition, on board any ſhip or veſſel, in order to transporting the ſame into any ſuch ports or places on the Coaſt of Africa (except as above excepted), without leave or permiſſion in that behalf, firſt obtained from His Maſteſty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and ſuffering the reſpective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, paſſed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of His Maſteſty King George the Second, intituled " An Act to empower His Maſteſty to prohibit the exportation of gun-powder, or any ſort of arms or
