The King has been pleased to give and grant unto the Right Honourable Sir Edward Thornton, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, late Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at the Court of Lisbon, His royal licence and permission, that he may, pursuant to the limitations of a royal decree of His Most Faithful Majesty John the Sixth, King of Portugal, Brazil, and the Algarves, bearing date the 13th day of May 1824, accept the title of Conde de Cassilhas, together with all rights, privileges, and advantages thereunto belonging, which title His Most Faithful Majesty was pleased to confer upon the said. Sir Edward Thornton as an especial and lasting testimony which that Sovereign entertained of the important services rendered by him in favour of His Majesty's Royal Person, and of the Portuguese Throne, in the crisis in which they had been at that period placed; and the King has been further pleased to allow, that the said Sir Edward Thornton, and his successors in the aforesaid dignity, may bear certain honourable armorial distinctions, allusive to his said services, granted by His Most Faithful Majesty, as the same are depicted in the painting annexed to the said royal warrant; such armorial distinctions being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and re-corded in the Heralds' Office, otherwise the said royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

Provided, nevertheless, that His Majesty's said concession shall not be deemed or construed to authorise, the assumption of the said title of Conde de Cassilhas within this realm:

And also to command, that the said royal concession and especial mark of His Majesty's favour, together with the aforesaid royal decree, and the relative documents, be registered in His Majesty's. College of Arms.

HEREAS it has been hambly representelf to the King, that John Howlinan, a seaman coast of Kent in the prevention of smuggling, having, in the evening of Sunday last, the 9th instant, by the orders of his superior Officer, Lieutenant William Colc, of the said ship, been placed and left on board a boat described by her crew as the Venus, of Folkestone, and which crew had been discovered in the act of sinking tubs of spirits), was forcibly thrown overboard and drowned, and his body was, in the course of the same evening; found on the sea shore near New Romney, with marks of violence upon it, and a Coroner and Jury' having held an inquest upon the same, have returned a verdict of wilful murder against persons unknown:

His Majesty, for the better discovering the persons who have committed this atrocious crime, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of the persons on board the said boat (except those who actually committed violence on the said John Howlihan, or aided in throwing him overboard), who shall discover his accomplices, so that they may be apprehended and brought to justice.

Paine, having been duly sworn, made outh and. said per that the sloop Tom Paine was owned by John Gampbell, of Montego-Bay, and that he sailed: in the said sloop from Kingston, on the 31st day of March 1825; bound to Maracaibo, in the island of Gubast consigned to a Mr. Hall, Merchant, there; and that off that place they were captured by a Colombian privateer, called the Isabella, of Maracaibo, commanded by John Bedwell, sailing with a Colombian commission; the Prizemaster and three seamen were put on board, with orders to take her to Maracaibo; and that himself and a :: boy only of the former crew were left; on board; : 1 that the plea for capture was, that the cargo was ; w Spanish property. And this deponent further said, that from the ignorance of the Prizemaster in navigating the said sloop to her destined port, long defention at sea, and being short of water, the saids Prizemaster, after passing the several harbours of Montego-Bay, St. Ann's, Port Maria, and Annotto-Bay, finally brought the vessel into Buff's Bay to get a supply thereof; and the reason for passing to the aforesaid harbours, was his fear of detention by? our vessels or the authorities ashore. The deposits nent further said, that he had no command over : W the vessel after the capture, either before or after? her anchorage at Buff-Bay on 23d April; ithe: Quartermaster and one seaman braving come on shore for water, deponent jumped overboard and swam on shore; that soon after Robert G. Kirkland. and William Robertson, Esqrs. Justices of the Peace, having heard of there being something suspicious in the said sloop's arrival; interrogated the deponent and the said two mens, and failing cin an attempt to procure the sloops papers of rom the high sea then running, they ordered the said two men into custody for that night.
