### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

### RHINS OF ISLAY LIGHT-HOUSE.

THE Commissioners of the Northern Lighthouses hereby give notice; that a light-house has been erected at the Rhins Point of the island of Islay, in the county of Argyll, which will be lighted on Tuesday the 15th day of November next, and continue thereafter to be exhibited every night, from the going away of day-light in the evening till the return of day-light in the morning.

The following Specification of the Position of the Light-house, and the Appearance of the Light, is given by Mr. Stevenson, Engineer to the Commissioners.

The Rhins of Islay Light-House is situate on the northern side of the entrance to Loch-Indaal, upon the small island of Oversa, in lat. 55 deg. 41 min. N. and lon. 6 deg. 29 min. W. It bears by compass from the Mull of Kinhoe N. by W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W. distant 10 miles; and from the Stationary Light of the Mull of Kintyre N. by W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W. distant 33 miles. From the north eastern extremity of the island of Rachlin N.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E. distant 25 miles. From the Revolving Light of Innistrahul E. distant 28 miles. From the Rocks of Skerry Vore, which lie 14 miles S. W. from Tiree, the Rhins Light-house bears S. distant 35 miles. From the Rocks of Duheertach, lying 11 miles S. W. distant 28 miles, and from Tanvorehead S. W. by S. distant 6 $\frac{1}{2}$  miles.

This light will be known to Mariners as a distinguishing light, exhibiting from the same lantern the effects of a stationary and a revolving light. To a distant observer, it will appear like a star of

light at every 12 seconds of time, without those intervals of total darkness which characterise other revolving lights upon the coast.

"The light will be from oil, with reflectors, elevated 150 feet above the medium level of the sea. In clear weather it will be visible at the distance of 6 leagues, and intermediately according to the, state of the atmosphere. The lanternais open toward Eaggan-Bay, within Loch-Indaal, and seaward from the Mull of Kinhoesty Tanvorehead.
