HEREAS by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the nineteenth of July last, it is directed, that all ships or vessels liable to quarantine, as are or shall be bound to the northern ports of Scotland, shall perform their quarantine at Cromarty-Bay, and that such of them as are or shall be bound to the south west ports of Scotland, shall perform their quarantine at Carsthorn; it is hereby ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that so much of the said Order in Council as relates to the performance of quarantine at Cromarty-Bay and Carsthorn, be, and the same is hereby, revoked; and His Majesty is pleased to order, by and with the advice aforesaid, that all ships or vessels as are or shall be bound to the northern ports of Scotland, comprehending the ports of

Inverness, Zetland, Caithness, and

Orkney, Stornaway,

or to any member, creek, or other place belonging to or within any or either of the above ports, shall perform their quarantine at Inverkeithing-Bay; and that such ships or vessels as are or shall be bound to the south west ports of Scotland, comprehending the ports of

> Dumfries and Kirkcudbright,

or to any member, creek, or other place belonging to or within either of the above ports, shall perform their quarantine at Holy Lock, in the Frith of Clyde.
