WHEREAS the Acts of the 5th Geo. IV. cap. 74, and the 6th Geo. IV. cap. 12, for establishing the new imperial standard weights and measures take effect from the 1st of January 1826; and whereas the same penalties which were levied by the 29th Geo. III. cap. 25, 31st Geo. II. cap. 17, 35th Geo. III. cap. 102, and 55th Geo. II. cap. 43, will be applicable in all instances where the measures or weights now in use shall be used after the 1st January, without having the proportion which they bear to the new imperial standards marked on them;

Notice is hereby given to all persons using weights and measures for the measuring and weighing for sale of any commodity, in the county of Middlesex, that Mr. W. Gutteridge, is appointed by the Magistrates of the aforesaid county, to perform the duties of Conservator of weights and measures for the said county, for the purpose of verifying all new weights and measures, and to aid the public in conforming to the provisions of the said Acts, by marking the several weights and measures now in use, with the proportions they respectively bear to the imperial standards, which may from time to time be brought to him for that purpose, of which he will duly advertise them and thus afford them that protection from the penalties incident upon neglect or ignorance of the 15th and 16th clauses of 5th Geo.
