The schedules are filed, and may be inspected every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, between the hours of Ten and Four, up to the last day for entering opposition.

Note 2.—Where upon the hearing of any case before the Court, the Court shall order the Prisoner to be removed, pursuant to the Act 5 Geo. 4, c. 61, s. 13, those Creditors only will be entitled to oppose the discharge of such Prisoner, at the hearing which shall take place in the country, in pursuance of such Order, who appeared to oppose before the Court on the day when such Order was made, or gave notice of opposition for that day,

and those upon whom the notices were not duly served for the hearing on that day.

THE Creditors of John Francis Dalby, late of the Town and County of the Town of Nottingham, Attorney, an Insolvent Debtor, are requested to meet the Assignee of his estate and effects, on Friday the 20th day of January next, at the Office of Mr. William Hopkinson, situate in Castle-Gate, in the Town of Nottingham, at Eleven o'Clock in the Forenoon, to assent to or dissent from the Assignee commencing any action or actions at law against the debtors to the said Insolvent's estate, or such of them as the said Assignee shall think proper, for the purpose of recovering the debts mentioned in the said Insolvent's schedule; and on other matters connected with the said Insolvent's estate.
