A PROCLAMATION:

GEORGE, R.

WHEREAS We have thought fit to order that certain pieces of copper money should be coined, which should be called "penny pieces," "halfpenny pieces," and "farthing pieces," every such penny piece having for the obverse impression our effigy laureated, with the inscription "Georgius IV, Dei Gratia," and the date of the year, and for the reverse impression the figure of Britannia, represented in a sitting posture, her right hand resting upon a shield, and holding in her left the trident, with the emblems of the United Kingdom underneath, and the inscription *Britanniar: Rex*: *Fid: Def:* every such halfpenny piece having for the obverse impression the aforesaid effigy, inscription, and date, and for the reverse the figure of Britannia, as described for the penny, with the same inscription and emblems; and every such

farthing piece having for the obverse impression the aforesaid effigy, inscription, and date, and for the reverse the figure of Britannia, as described for the penny, with the same inscription and emblems: And whereas pieces of copper money, of the descriptions aforesaid, have been coined at Our Mint, and will be coined there, We have, therefore, with the advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this Proclamation; and We do hereby declare, ordain, and command that all such pieces of copper money so coined, and to be coined as aforesaid, shall be current and lawful money of the Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and shall pass and be received as current and lawful money of the said Kingdom; every such penny piece, as of the value of one penny, of like lawful money; every such halfpenny piece, as of the value of one halfpenny, of like lawful money; and every such farthing piece, as of the value of one farthing, of like lawful money: Provided that no person shall be obliged to take more of such penny pieces in any one payment than shall be of the value of one shilling, after the rate aforesaid, or take more of such halfpenny or farthing pieces in any one payment than shall be of the value of sixpence, after the rate aforesaid.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, the thirtieth day of January one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, and in the seventh year of Our reign.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament, made and passed in the sixth year of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for granting Duties of Customs," it is, among other things, enacted, "that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time, to order and direct, that there shall be levied and collected any additional duty, not exceeding one-fifth of the amount of any existing duty, upon all or any goods, when imported in the ships of any country which shall levy higher or other duties upon goods when imported in British

“ ships than when imported in the national ships
“ of such country :”

And whereas higher and other duties are levied in the ports of the United Netherlands on certain goods when imported in British ships than when imported in Netherland ships, His Majesty does therefore, under the authority of the above recited Act, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, order, that upon all goods imported into the United Kingdom in Netherland ships from and after the date of this Order, there shall be levied and collected, in addition to the existing duties otherwise payable upon the importation of such goods, a further duty, amounting to one-fifth part of such existing duties :

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament, made and passed in the fifth year of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled “ An Act “ to indemnify all persons concerned in advising, “ issuing, or acting under a certain Order in “ Council, for regulating the tonnage duties on “ certain foreign vessels, and to amend an Act “ of the last session of Parliament, for authorising His Majesty, under certain circumstances, “ to regulate the duties and drawbacks on goods “ imported or exported in any foreign vessels,” it is, amongst other things, enacted; “ that from “ and after the passing of the said Act, it shall “ and may be lawful to and for His Majesty, “ by and with the advice of His Privy Council, “ or by His Majesty's Order or Orders in Council, “ to be published from time to time in the London Gazette (whenever it shall be deemed expedient) to levy and charge any additional or “ countervailing duty or duties of tonnage upon “ or in respect of any vessels which shall “ enter any of the ports in the United Kingdom “ of Great Britain and Ireland, or in any of His “ Majesty's dominions, and which shall belong “ to any foreign country in which any duties “ of tonnage shall have been or shall be levied

“ upon or in respect of British vessels entering “ the ports of such country, higher or greater “ than are levied or granted upon or in respect “ of the vessels of such country: And it is “ thereby provided, that such additional or countervailing tonnage duties, so be levied and charged “ as aforesaid, shall not be of greater amount than “ may be deemed fairly to countervail the difference of duty paid in such foreign country “ upon or in respect of the tonnage of British “ vessels more than the duty there charged or “ granted upon or in respect of the vessels of “ such country.”

And whereas duties of tonnage are levied upon, or in respect of, British vessels entering the ports of the United Netherlands laden with salt, higher or greater than are levied and granted upon, or in respect of, the vessels of the United Netherlands aforesaid, entering the ports aforesaid, laden with salt :

And such higher tonnage duties are, in the ports aforesaid, levied upon, and in respect of, so much only of the tonnage of such British vessels as is actually employed in the carriage and importation of such salt, and are equivalent to one pound thirteen shillings and four pence for every ton of such vessels so employed :

His Majesty doth, therefore, under the authority of the above recited Act, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, order, that from and after the date of this Order, there shall be levied and charged upon, or in respect of all vessels belonging to the United Netherlands aforesaid, which shall enter any of the ports of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, such additional or countervailing duty of tonnage as aftermentioned, that is to say, there shall be levied upon every such Netherland vessel which shall so enter the said ports, a duty of one pound thirteen shillings and four pence upon each and every ton burthen of the said vessel, which upon her clearing out from any such port, for any port in the Kingdom of the United Netherlands, shall be actually occupied and employed in the carriage and exportation of salt, the tonnage or burthen so made subject to such additional or countervailing duty being deemed to be equivalent to the number of tons of the weight of such salt ascertained prior to the shipment thereof:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Windsor-Castle, January 30, 1826.

This day His Excellency the Count Lieven, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the Emperor of Russia, had a private audience of His Majesty to deliver his new credentials in that character; His Excellency the Marquis de Palmella, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from His Most Faithful Majesty, had a private audience of His Majesty, to deliver a letter from his Sovereign; and the Baron de Itabayana, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the Emperor of Brazil, had a private audience of His Majesty to deliver his credentials: To which audiences they were respectively introduced by the Right Honourable George Canning, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.

Windsor Castle, January 30, 1826

A CHAPTER of the Most Noble Order of the Garter having been summoned for this day, the following Knights Companions in the full habit of the Order assembled in the King's Drawing-Room, viz: their Royal Highnesses the Dukes of York and Clarence, the Earl of Westmoreland, the Duke of Montrose, the Earl of Liverpool and Earl Bathurst, attended by the undernamed Officers of the Order, viz. the Lord Bishop of Winchester, Prelate of the Order; the Honourable and Reverend the Dean of Windsor Register of the Order; and Sir George Nayler, Knight, Garter Principal King of Arms.

At three o'clock the Knights Companions and Officers of the Order proceeded into the presence of the Sovereign in the Chapter-Room.

The Sovereign and the Knights Companions being seated, the Prelate signified to the Chapter the Sovereign's royal will and pleasure, that the vacant stall in the Royal Chapel of Saint George be filled; and as by the statutes none but a Knight can be elected, His Grace Charles Duke of Dorset was introduced by Garter, and knighted by His Majesty with the sword of state; after which His Grace, having kissed the Sovereign's hand, retired.

The Knights Companions then proceeded to the election, and the suffrages having been collected by the Prelate, were by him presented to the Sovereign, who was pleased to command him to declare, and he accordingly declared, that the Most Noble Charles Duke of Dorset had been duly elected a Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter.

Then, by the Sovereign's command, his Grace was received at the door of the Chapter-Room by the Earl of Liverpool and Earl Bathurst, the two Junior Knights Companions present, and conducted between them to His Majesty, preceded by Garter (bearing the ensigns of the Order upon a crimson velvet cushion). The Duke of Dorset, kneeling near the Sovereign, and Garter presenting, on his knee, the Garter, His Majesty, assisted by their Royal Highnesses the Dukes of York and Clarence, the two Senior Knights Companions, buckled it on his Grace's left leg; the Prelate pronouncing the usual admonition.

Garter next presented, in like manner, the ribbon with the George; and His Majesty, with the assistance of the two Senior Knights Companions, put the same over his Grace's left shoulder; the Prelate pronouncing the admonition. The Duke, having again kissed the Sovereign's hand, and received the congratulations of each of the Knights Companions, withdrew.

The Chapter being ended, the Knights Companions and the Officers of the Order, retired from the presence of the Sovereign with the usual reverences.

CHAPLAINS' BOUNTY.

MONEY being in the hands of the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy to pay Bounty for the year 1825, to such Chaplains of the Royal Navy as are entitled thereto under His Majesty's

Order in Council, bearing date the 1st February 1765, 1st February 1784, and 22d October 1802, and who have been entered upon the list by virtue of the papers they have respectively transmitted to this Office; notice is hereby given, that the payment of the same will commence at the Pay-Office, Somerset-place, on Wednesday the 1st of February next, at ten o'clock in the morning. And it is desired that in future, the Chaplains entitled to the Bounty will, as soon as it may become due, cause their affidavits to be delivered into this Office, in order to expedite the payment.

Navy-Office, January 28, 1826.

THE Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed money for the payment of half-pay to Sea Officers, from the 1st October to the 31st December last, according to His Majesty's establishment in that behalf; these are to give notice, that the several payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office, by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, at ten o'clock in the morning, on the following days, viz.

On the 6th, 7th, and 8th of February, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies.

On the 9th, 10th, 13th, 14th, and 15th of February, to Lieutenants and Chaplains, and their Attornies.

On the 16th and 17th of February, to Masters, Surgeons, and Pursers, and their Attornies.

After which the lists will be recalled the first and third Wednesday in every month, that all persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them, and bring with them an affidavit as required by Order in Council of 30th July 1819, the forms of which were published in an advertisement from this Office, dated 16th September 1819, and may be procured at the Office of the Treasurer of the Navy; and in case any of the said Officers should not be able to attend themselves, but employ Attornies for that purpose, the said Attornies are to produce similar affidavits from the persons they are employed by.

Where Officers are abroad on leave, their agents are to produce attested copies of such leave, before the half-pay can be paid.

And as by Act of Parliament, passed in the thirty-fifth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious method for the payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the twentieth clause of the said Act, "that if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive half-pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near the place of his residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, in London, to have such half-pay paid at or near the place of his residence, &c. in the manner pointed out by the said Act;" and by a further Act, passed in the fifty-sixth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for enabling the Officers in His Majesty's Navy,

and their representatives, to draw for and receive their half-pay," it is enacted by the first and third clauses of the said Act, "that if any Officer in His Majesty's Navy, who shall be entitled to receive any sum of money for or on account of his half-pay, shall be desirous of drawing a bill of exchange for the same upon the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy, instead of receiving the same by remittance bill, he shall signify such desire, by letter, to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy; and that if any Officer in His Majesty's Navy, who shall be entitled to receive any sum of money for or on account of half-pay, shall be desirous of having his half-pay paid to him by extract at any of His Majesty's Dock-Yards where Clerks for the payment of wages for the Navy shall reside, instead of receiving the same by remittance bill or bill of exchange, he is to apply either to the proper Clerk, at the Navy Pay-Office, in London, or at the Pay-Office at such Dock-Yard, signifying such his desire;" notice is hereby further given, that the half-pay ending the 31st December last, will commence paying on the 6th of February next; and all persons desirous of drawing for or of having their half-pay remitted to them, may apply as above directed.
