That your petitioner is advised and verily believes that the right of election so determined by the said Select Committee is not the ancient and true right of election for the said borough, but is contrary to law; and your petitioner is not, therefore, satisfied with the said resolution, and is desirous of being admitted a party to oppose such right of election, and to have the benefit of the Statute in that case made and provided; therefore, to prevent the judgment of the said Select Committee from being final and conclusive, your petitioner humbly prays your Honourable House that he may be admitted as a party according to the form of the Statute in this case made and provided, to oppose the right of election in favour of which the said Select Committee have so reported; and that your petitioner may have such other relief in the premises as to this Honourable House shall seem meet, and the nature of the case shall require."
