

son to depart from their former Conclusions; That they were still of opinion that it was absolutely necessary in this conjuncture to establish a firm Peace with the Crown of France, and that they could by no means consent to what was proposed of sending their Resolutions to the Emperor, for the prejudice it might be to their ancient Liberty.

Hamburg, May 4. They write from Copenhagen of the first Instant, That the King of Denmark intended to part from thence about the 20th for *Holstein*; and that the Danish Troops are marching to their general Rendezvous. From Zell we have an account, That the Sieur de *Haxhusen* was arrived there in quality of Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Denmark, and that he had had his first Audience of the Duke of Zell; and that the Baron de *Welling*, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Sweden, was parted from thence on his return home.

Hamburg, May 11. The Letters from Copenhagen give us an account, That the general Rendezvous of the King of Denmark's Troops is to be on the 26th of this Month on the *Cropperheyde*, near *Sleswick*; That the King would part from Copenhagen about the 20th, and intended to be at *Gluckstadt* the 24th. They work with very great diligence on the new Fortifications they are making at *Gluckstadt*. From *Berlin* they write, That the Sieur *Bierman*, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Denmark has had several private Conferences with the Elector of Brandenburg's Ministers; That there was a discourse that his Electoral Highness was going to raise more Forces, and that he had ordered his Equipage to be prepared which he usually takes with him when he goes into the Field. The Sieur *Haxhusen*, the Danish Envoy, continues at Zell, but we know not what success he has in his Negotiation there. Our Letters from *Warsaw* inform us, That the King of Poland had declared his resolution of taking a Journey towards *Prussia* in July; and that they have begun their new Levies in order to the forming the Army they are to have on Foot in pursuance of the Alliance concluded between the Emperor and that Crown.

Cologne, May 7. The Bishop of *Strasbourg* intends it's said to go for *Alsace* about the end of this month, to meet his most Christian Majesty at *Strasbourg*. From *Frankfort* they write, That great Preparations are making at *Wirtsbouurg* for the Interment of the Bishop of *Wirtsbouurg* and *Bamberg*.

Paris, May 15. The Marquils de *Saignelay*, who parted from hence the 24 of the last month for *Marseilles* and *Thoulon*, is come back, and, as we are informed, has given the King an account, that his Fleet of Men of War and Gallies are sailed under the command of the Marquils du *Quefne*. The Marquils de *Villars*, formerly Ambassador from this Crown in *Spain*, is preparing for his Embassy to *Denmark*, from whence Monsieur de *Mortangis* is recalled. Several Troops are marching towards *Rouffillon* to form the Camp which the King intends to have on that side this Summer; it's said there will be about 10000 Men. The Officers of *Chassean Trompette*, who were imprisoned for suffering the Marquils de *Flamartin*, who was lately seized on account of a Duel he was many years ago engaged in, to escape, have again obtained their liberty.

Deal May 8. This day sailed out of the Downs the *Success* and the *Scipio Africanus* bound for *Surat*, together with three or four other Merchant Ships outward bound.

Purimook May 8. On Sunday last came into this Harbour from the Westward His Majesty's Ship the *Rejerue*.

Windsor, May 6. This Evening at a Chapter of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, *Thomas Duopa* Esq; First Gentleman Usher Daily-Waiter to His Majesty, being introduced by the Register of the Order, and Garter Principal King of Arms, and the Letters Patent for Constituting him Usher of the Black Rod being read, was Invested with the Mantle, Gold-Chain, and Badge belonging to that Office, and had the Black-Rod delivered unto him by His Majesty: After which, having taken the accustomed Oath, His Majesty was pleased to confer upon him the Honour of Knighthood.

London, May 8. This day the Lord Chief Justice *Saunders* sitting at the *Guilbeal*, after a long Tryal, *Thomas Pilkington* and *Samuel Shute* Esquires, late Sheriffs of this City, *Ford* Lord *Gray*, *Henry Cornish* Alderman, *Sir Thomas Payer*, *Slingsby Bethel*, and divers others, were found Guilty of a Riot and Assault made on *Sir John Moor*, Knight, the late Lord-Mayor, upon *Midsummer-day* last, being the day for Election of Sheriffs and other Officers for this City.
