Turks are Encamped near Newhenfel; and that a firong Party belonging to that place has been defrated by Major General Sthurz; and 700 of the Turks flain upon the place. Colint Teckeley's Se cretary remains still here, but without any buliness that appears. From Poland they tell us, That that King has appointed the Troops he has now on Foot to Rendezvous on the 14th of the next Month in the Neighbourhood of Cracaw.

Ratubonne, May 10. The Director of the Col-ledge of Princes has defired the Bilhop of Mebijade, the Emperor's Commissioner, to use his Authority with the Electoral Collegge, in order to the reconciling the difference between the two Colledges, which is so prejudicial to the whole Empire, seeing the important Points concerning the publick Security, and the Treaty with France, are thereby obstructed. The Emperor and the King of Polini are fending Amballadors to Modeovy, to invite the Czars to enter into the Alliance concluded between them against the Turkes.
