The Speech of the Lords Commissioners to both Houses of Parliament, on Wednesday, May 31, 1826.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

HIS Majesty commands us to inform you, that the state of the public business enabling His Majesty to close the session at a period of the year the most convenient for a general election, it is His Majesty's intention to dissolve, without delay, the present Parliament, and to direct the issue of writs for the calling of a new one.

His Majesty cannot take leave of you without commanding us to express His Majesty's deep sense of the zeal and public spirit which you have constantly displayed in the discharge of your several important functions.

His Majesty particularly acknowledges the promptitude and discretion with which you have applied yourselves to the objects specially recommended to you by His Majesty, at the commencement of this session; and His Majesty confidently hopes that the good effect of your deliberations will be manifested in the improved stability of public and private credit.

His Majesty has the satisfaction to inform you, that the distinguished skill, bravery, and success with which the operations of the British arms in the Dominions of the King of Ava have been carried on, have led to the signature, upon highly honour-

able terms, of a preliminary treaty with that Sovereign, which His Majesty has every reason to expect will be the foundation of a secure and permanent peace.

His Majesty further commands us to repeat to you, that His Majesty's earnest endeavours have continued to be unremittingly exerted to prevent the breaking out of hostilities among nations, and to put an end to those which still unhappily exist, as well in America as in Europe.

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

His Majesty commands us to thank you for the provision which you have made for the service of the year.

His Majesty's attention will be constantly directed to the reduction of the public expenditure in every degree that may be consistent with the due maintenance of the security, honour, and interests of his kingdom.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

We are specially commanded to assure you, that His Majesty's paternal feelings have been deeply affected by the distresses which have prevailed among the manufacturing classes of His Majesty's subjects, and by the exemplary patience with which those distresses have been generally borne.

His Majesty trusts that the causes, out of which the partial stagnation of employment has arisen, are, under the blessing of Providence, in a course of gradual abatement.

His Majesty is confident that your presence and example in your several counties will contribute to maintain and encourage the loyal and orderly spirit which pervades the great body of his people; and His Majesty relies upon your disposition to inculcate that harmony and mutual good-will among

the several great interests of the country, upon which the common prosperity of them all essentially depends.

Then a commission for proroguing the Parliament was read; after which the Lord Chancellor said:

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

By virtue of His Majesty's Commission, under the Great Seal, to us and other Lords directed, and now read, we do, in His Majesty's name, and in obedience to his commands, prorogue this Parliament to Wednesday, the fourteenth day of June next, to be then here holden; and this Parliament is accordingly prorogued to Wednesday the fourteenth day of June next.

A PROCLAMATION,

For Dissolving the present Parliament, and declaring the Calling of another.

GEORGE, R.

WHEREAS We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to dissolve this present Parliament, which stands prorogued to Wednesday the fourteenth day of June instant: We do, for that end, publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby dissolve the said Parliament accordingly; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are discharged from their meeting and attendance on the said Wednesday the fourteenth day of June instant. And We being desirous and resolved, as soon as may be, to meet Our people, and to have their advice in Parliament, do hereby make known to all Our loving subjects Our royal will and pleasure to call a new Parliament: And do hereby further declare, that, with the advice of Our Privy Council, We have given order to Our

Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, and Our Chancellor of Ireland, that they do respectively, upon notice hereof, forthwith issue out Writs in due form, and according to Law, for calling a new Parliament: And We do hereby also, by this Our Royal Proclamation under Our Great Seal of Our United Kingdom, require Writs forthwith to be issued accordingly by Our said Chancellors respectively, for causing the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, who are to serve in the said Parliament, to be duly returned to, and give their attendance in, our said Parliament; which Writs are to be returnable on Tuesday the twenty-fifth day of July next.

A PROCLAMATION,

In order to the Electing and Summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland.

GEORGE, R.

WHEREAS We have, in Our Council, thought fit to declare Our pleasure for summoning and holding a Parliament of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, on Tuesday the twenty-fifth day of July next ensuing the date hereof: in order therefore to the electing and summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, who are to sit in the House of Peers in the said Parliament, We do, by the advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at Holyrood-House, in Edinburgh, on Thursday the thirteenth day of July next ensuing, between the hours of twelve and two in the afternoon, to nominate and choose the Sixteen Peers to sit and vote in the House of Peers, in the said ensuing Parliament, by open Election and plurality of voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the Proxies of such as shall be absent (such Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in Writing, duly signed before witnesses, and both the Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to law). And the Lord Clerk Register, or such two of the Principal Clerks of the Session as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his name, are hereby respectively required to attend such

Meeting, and to administer the Oaths required by law to be taken there by the said Peers, and to take their votes; and immediately after such Election made and duly examined, to certify the names of the Sixteen Peers so elected, and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the Electors, and return such Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain. And We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly command and require the Provost of Edinburgh, and all other the Magistrates of the said City, to take especial care to preserve the peace thereof, during the time of the said election; and to prevent all manner of Riots, Tumults, Disorders, and Violence whatsoever. And We strictly charge and command, that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market-Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the county towns of Scotland, twenty-five days, at least, before the time hereby appointed for the meeting of the said Peers to proceed to such election.

Witness Ourself at Westminster, this second day of June one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, and in the seventh year of Our reign.

HIS Majesty, having been pleased to appoint Lieutenant-General Sir Henry Warde, Governor of the island of Barbadoes, he this day took the usual oaths appointed to be taken by the Governors of His Majesty's Plantations.

Westminster, May 31, 1826.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for applying a sum out of the consoli-

dated fund, and the surplus of the grants of the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, to the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, and for further appropriating the supplies granted in this Session of Parliament.

An Act to permit foreign corn, meal, and flour warehoused, to be taken out for home consumption, until the 16th day of August one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six.

An Act to empower His Majesty to admit foreign corn for home consumption under certain limitations, until the 1st day of January one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven, or for six weeks after the commencement of the then next ensuing Session of Parliament, if Parliament shall not then be sitting.

An Act to amend the law in respect to the offence of stealing from gardens and hot-houses.

An Act to explain an Act of the fifty-third year of the reign of His late Majesty, respecting the enrolment of memorials of grants of annuities.

An Act for further extending the powers of an Act for vesting in Commissioners the bridges building over the Menai Straits and the river Conway, and the harbours of Howth and Holyhead, and the road from Dublin to Howth, and for the further improvement of the road from London to Holyhead.

An Act for consolidating the trusts of the several turnpike-roads in the neighbourhood of the Metropolis, north of the river Thames.

An Act to extend to Charing-cross, the Strand, and places adjacent, the powers of an Act for making a more convenient communication from Mary-le-bone-park, and to enable the Commissioners of His Majesty's woods, forests, and land revenues to grant leases of the site of Carlton Palace.

An Act to vest in the Commissioners of His Majesty's woods, forests, and land revenues, the powers of several Acts for the improvement of the streets near Westminster Hall and the Houses of Parliament, and to authorize the conversion of the pavements in several parts of the metropolis into broken stone roads.

An Act for consolidating and amending the laws relating to prisons in Ireland.

An Act to consolidate and amend the laws which regulate the levy and application of church rates and parish cesses, and the election of churchwardens, and the maintenance of parish clerks in Ireland.

An Act to consolidate the laws in force in Ireland for the disappropriation of benefices annexed to dignities, and for the appropriation of others in their stead, and for uniting benefices with dignities, and to make further provisions for the like purposes.

An Act for making and maintaining a railway or tram-road, from the city of Limerick to the town of Carrick, in the county of Tipperary, with several branches therefrom, in the county of Tipperary aforesaid, and in the county of the city of Waterford.

An Act to amend an Act of His late Majesty's reign for confirming certain articles of agreement between the company of proprietors of the Grand Junction Canal, and certain persons for supplying with water the inhabitants of Paddington and

places adjacent, in the county of Middlesex, and also an Act of His said late Majesty's reign, to alter certain Acts relating to the Grand Junction Canal the Grand Junction Water-works, and the Regent's Canal, in order to effect an exchange of water for the better supply of the Regent's Canal Navigation and Grand Junction Water-works, and for amending the powers vested in the Grand Junction Water-works Company, and for other purposes relating thereto.

An Act to repeal an Act of the twenty-fourth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, for the better relief and employment of the poor belonging to several parishes within the town of Shrewsbury, and the liberties thereof, in the county of Salop, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof.

And one private Act.

Carlton-House, June 1, 1826.

This day the Baron de Stierneid, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Sweden, had a private audience of His Majesty to deliver a letter from his Sovereign; to which he was introduced by the Right Honourable George Canning, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knight, Master of the Ceremonies.

The King has been pleased to direct letters patent to be passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, constituting and appointing the Right Honourable Charles Watkin Williams Wynn; Henry Earl Bathurst, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter; the Right Honourable George Canning, and the Right Honourable Robert Peel, His Majesty's three Principal Secretaries of State; Robert Banks, Earl of Liverpool, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, First Commissioner of His Majesty's Treasury; the Right Honourable Frederick John Robinson, Chancellor of His Majesty's Exchequer; Arthur Duke of Wellington, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter; James Brownlow William Marquess of Salisbury; John Baron Teignmouth; the Right Honourable John Sullivan; the Right Honourable Sir George Warrender, Bart.; Joseph Phillimore, Doctor of Laws; and William Yates Peel, Esq. His Majesty's Commissioners for the affairs of India.

First Class.

And rent after the expiration of six weeks, 1d. $\frac{1}{2}$ register ton $\frac{1}{2}$ week.

Ships or Vessels loading for any of those Places,

not having previously discharged their Cargoes in the Dock, remaining in the Dock a Period not exceeding Four Weeks;

For every register ton of the vessel, 6d.
And rent after the expiration of four weeks, 1d. $\frac{1}{2}$ register ton $\frac{1}{2}$ week.

Third Class.

Ships or Vessels arriving from all other Ports or Places whatsoever (except the Southern Whale Fishery), remaining in the Dock a Period not exceeding Four Weeks, with liberty to reload;

For every register ton of the vessel, 9d.
And rent after the expiration of four weeks, 1d. $\frac{1}{2}$ register ton $\frac{1}{2}$ week.

Ships or Vessels loading for any of those Places, not having previously discharged their Cargoes in the Dock, remaining in the Dock a Period not exceeding Four Weeks;

For every register ton of the vessel, 9d.
And rent after the expiration of four weeks, 1d. $\frac{1}{2}$ register ton $\frac{1}{2}$ week.

Ships or Vessels laden with Cork, or with Wool from Spain, remaining in the Dock a Period not exceeding Two Weeks;

For every register ton of the vessel, 6d.
And rent after the expiration of two weeks, 3d. $\frac{1}{2}$ register ton $\frac{1}{2}$ week.

Fourth Class.

Vessels to or from the Southern Fisheries;
For every register ton of the vessel, 1s.
And rent after the expiration of six weeks, 1d. $\frac{1}{2}$ register ton $\frac{1}{2}$ week.
For every tun of oil delivered into craft, 6d.

Light Vessels entering the Dock to lie up;
Entrance, £1 1s.
Rent of the vessel, 1d. $\frac{1}{2}$ register ton $\frac{1}{2}$ week.
And on leaving the dock light, £1 1s.

Vessels that load in the dock, pay dues according to their ports of destination, instead of those on light vessels.

Coasters entering the dock for the purpose of delivering goods on board vessels outward bound, only pay 6d. $\frac{1}{2}$ ton upon their register tonnage, or 1s. $\frac{1}{2}$ ton on the goods delivered (see First Class).

Vessels which deliver goods overboard in the dock, or take in goods from craft in the dock, pay 3d. $\frac{1}{2}$ ton for such goods, in addition to the before-mentioned rates (except goods brought from the East or West India Docks); and vessels which take in chalk, pay 6d. $\frac{1}{2}$ ton in addition to such rates on the quantity shipped.

Vessels which have discharged part of their cargoes at an out-port, or have goods on board intended for an out-port, pay dock dues only on the quantity of goods landed.

Whenever required, the Company will discharge the cargo of a vessel on the following terms, viz.

If consisting of tallow or cotton, for 6d. $\frac{1}{2}$ register ton of the vessel;

If of casks, bales, or general merchandize, for 9d. $\frac{1}{2}$ register ton;

If of hemp, for 1s. $\frac{1}{2}$ register ton;

provided the entries for the goods be all made previously to the ship breaking bulk.
