And also for proroguing the Convocations of Canterbury and York, which were appointed to meet on Wednesday the twenty-sixth day of this instant July, to Friday the twenty-fifth day of August next.

A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, R.

**W**HEREAS We have heretofore been pleased to direct that copper money should be coined of the currency of Ireland, to be circulated only in that part of Our United Kingdom, and to pass current as one penny, one halfpenny, and one farthing respectively, of such Irish currency; and whereas an Act, passed in the sixth year of Our reign, for the assimilation of the currency and monies of account throughout the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, under the provisions of which We directed a new copper coinage to be prepared for circulation in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and which by a Proclamation issued by Our Lord Lieutenant of Ireland,

dated Dublin the twenty-sixth December one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, was directed to be current at the following rates, viz.: one penny as the twelfth part of one British silver shilling, one halfpenny as the twenty-fourth part of one British silver shilling, and one farthing as the forty-eighth part of one British silver shilling: and it was by the said Proclamation provided, that the several pieces of copper money of the then currency of Ireland should, until otherwise declared, pass current according to the then standard value, viz.: the penny piece as of the value of one thirteenth part of one British silver shilling, one halfpenny as of the value of one twenty-sixth part of one British silver shilling, and one farthing as of the value of one fifty-second part of a British silver shilling; and whereas it has been represented to Us, that great inconveniencies arise from the copper coin heretofore coined for Ireland being current at a different and lower rate than that coined for the general circulation of the United Kingdom, and that it will be a considerable time before the same can be recoinced; we have, therefore, with the advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this Our Proclamation; and We do hereby declare and command, that all such pieces of copper money of the said currency of Ireland, as have heretofore been coined for circulation in that part of the United Kingdom, shall, from and after the date hereof, cease to be current in Ireland at the rates aforesaid; and that from and after the date hereof all such pieces of copper money shall be the current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and until the same shall be called in and recoinced shall pass and be received as current and lawful money of

the said United Kingdom, at the rates following; that is to say, every such penny piece of the said currency as the twelfth part of one shilling British silver money; every such halfpenny piece as the twenty-fourth part of one shilling British silver money; and every such farthing piece as the forty-eighth part of one shilling British silver money: Provided that no person shall be obliged to take more of such penny pieces, in one payment, than shall be of the value of one shilling, after the rate aforesaid, or to take more of such halfpenny, or farthing pieces, in any one payment, than shall be of the value of six pence, after the rate aforesaid.

Given at Our Court, at Windsor, this twelfth day of July one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, and in the seventh year of Our reign.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-sixth year of His late Majesty's reign, cap. 38, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to suspend the ballot or enrolment for the local militia," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by any Order in Council, to direct that no ballot or enrolment for the local militia shall take place; but that such ballot and enrolment shall remain and continue suspended for the period specified in any such Order of Council, and from time to time, by any like Order or Orders in Council, to continue such suspension so long as His Majesty shall deem the same expedient, any thing in any Act or Acts of Parliament to the contrary notwithstanding: and whereas by an Order in Council, made the nineteenth day of July last, it was ordered by His Majesty in Council, that no ballot or enrolment for the local militia should take place for the space of one year from the sixteenth day of July last, but that the ballot and enrolment for the local militia should remain and continue suspended for the space of one year from the said sixteenth day of July last: and whereas it is deemed expedient to continue such suspension of the ballot and enrolment for the local militia for the space of one year from and after the sixteenth day of this in-

stant July; it is, therefore, ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that no ballot or enrolment for the local militia do take place for the space of one year from and after the sixteenth day of this instant July, but that the ballot and enrolment for the local militia do remain and continue suspended for the space of one year from and after the sixteenth day of this instant July.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order of His Majesty in Council, dated nineteenth July one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, sec. 38, it is directed with respect to vessels having on board any of the articles enumerated in the said Order, and intending to import the same into any port or place in the United Kingdom, or the islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any port or place in Europe without the Streights, or on the Continent of America, at which there is not a regular establishment for the performance of quarantine, declared sufficient by His Majesty in Council for the due performance of quarantine, that the master, or other person having charge of every such vessel, shall produce certain declarations described in the said Order: and whereas it is further directed, that if it shall appear from the said declarations that any of the said enumerated articles, so imported as aforesaid, are of the growth, produce, or manufacture of Turkey, or of any place in Africa within the Streights of Gibraltar, or in the West Barbary, or the Atlantic Ocean, such goods, with the vessels, crews, &c. importing the same, shall perform quarantine in the manner set forth in the said Order: and whereas there is at present in the port of Bordeaux a regular establishment for the performance of quarantine, and all necessary precautions are there taken for preventing the introduction of the plague, or any other infectious disorder, by the importation of articles from Turkey, or elsewhere, and such establishment is by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, hereby declared sufficient for the due performance of quarantine; His Majesty is, therefore, pleased, by and with the advice aforesaid, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the date of this

Order, the Masters or other persons having the charge or command of vessels arriving in any of the ports of the United Kingdom, or of the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from the said port of Bordeaux, having taken on board any of the said enumerated articles at the port of Bordeaux, shall not be required to produce the declarations described in the thirty-eighth section of the said Order in Council of nineteenth July one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five :

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors and Commanders in Chief for the time being of the isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

## TO ALIENS.

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, every Alien who shall, on the *first day of July next*, be in this realm, is required on the same day, or within fourteen days thereafter, to make a declaration in writing of his or her place of abode, names, rank, occupation, and description; (and if a domestic servant, then also the place of abode, names, rank, and description of his or her master or mistress,) and of the country and place from whence he or she came, or of which he or she is a native, and of the time when he or she last came from foreign parts into this realm; and to transmit such declaration by the post, if in Great Britain, to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department at the Alien-Office in Westminster, and if in Ireland, to the Chief Secretary of the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland; and such declaration must be signed by the party making it, if able to write, or otherwise be attested by a magistrate of the place, or by the officiating minister of the parish, or by one or more of the churchwardens or overseers of the poor of the parish or township where such Alien shall be: but one such declaration will be sufficient for a parent or parents and any number of children, if made by the father, or in case of his death or incapacity, by the mother.

And by the said Act it is further required, that every Alien in this realm, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July in every year, shall, within one week after those respective days, make a declaration in writing of his or her place of residence, and therein state at what place he or she intends in future to reside, and shall within the same week transmit such declaration by the post, in the manner before prescribed; and power is given to one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State to require any Alien in Great Britain, and for the Chief Secretary for Ireland to require any Alien in Ireland to make a declaration of his or her actual place of residence, and of the place at which he or she intends to reside in future, at shorter intervals than six months.

And it is enacted, That if any Alien in any of the cases aforesaid shall neglect to make such declaration, or to transmit the same within the time limited, or shall wilfully make or transmit any false declaration, he or she shall, upon conviction thereof before two justices of the peace, for every such offence, either forfeit a sum not exceeding fifty pounds, or be imprisoned for a time not exceeding six months, at the discretion of such justices.

Upon the receipt at this Office of a regular declaration in any of the cases aforesaid, a certificate, setting forth the names, rank, occupation, and description of the Alien, and his or her place of abode, will be immediately made out, and transmitted to him or her by post; and if any Alien shall, by his or her default, not be possessed of such certificate, or shall without any lawful excuse reside in any other place than that expressed in such certificate, every such Alien shall for every such offence forfeit twenty pounds; and if any Alien, being required by any justice of the peace to produce such certificate, shall refuse or neglect so to do, he or she shall be deemed not to be possessed of any certificate.

The Act further provides, That if any certificate issued to any Alien shall be lost, mislaid, or destroyed, and such Alien shall produce to one of His Majesty's justices of the peace proof thereof, and shall make it appear to the satisfaction of such justice that he or she hath duly conformed with the Act, such justice shall testify the same under his hand, and such Alien shall thereby be entitled to demand a fresh certificate.

Where any Alien, about to depart from this realm, shall be desirous of having possession of the passport delivered on his or her debarkation, and shall notify by letter to the Alien-Office in Westminster, or to the Chief Secretary's Office in Dublin, the port at which he or she intends to embark, such passport will be transmitted by the post to the Chief Officer of the Customs of the port so notified, to be delivered to such Alien, on his or her making a declaration in writing of his or her intention of departing, and delivering such declaration to the Chief Officer of the Customs at the port of departure: and a penalty of five pounds will be incurred by every Alien neglecting to make or deliver such declaration.

The only Aliens exempted from the provisions of this Act are the following, viz.: every foreign Ambassador or public Minister, and their domestic servants registered as such according to law, or being actually attendant upon them; every Alien who shall have been continually residing within this realm for seven years next before the passing of this Act, and obtained from the Alien-Office a certificate thereof, and every Alien under the age of fourteen years: and it is provided that if any question shall arise whether any person alleged to be an Alien, and to be subject to the provisions of the Act, is an Alien or not, or is or is not subject to those provisions, the proof shall lie on the Alien.

And every certificate is to be issued without fee or reward.

Of all which provisions notice is hereby given to the end that no person may plead ignorance thereof.
