HE Commissioners appointed to carry into effect the several Conventions for liquidating the Claims of British Subjects and others against the Government of France, in pursuance of the 18th section of the Act passed for the above purpose, in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, having notified, that, on or before the 19th day of January last, and since the passing of the aforesaid Act of Parliament, they have liquidated, rejected, &c. under Convention No. 7, nine hundred and fifty-eight cases, and have paid in full all such Sums as had been found to be due thereon, do farther, in pursuance of the said Act, give notice, that, between the 19th day of January last and the date hereof, they have, in obedience to the decision of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, liquidated the following Claims, on which they have issued their Certificates for the Sums found to be due:
