Broffels, May 28. On Tuciday last the Marquils de Grana returned hither fiom Anim.rp, wh re he had had a Conference with the Prince of Oranges The Duke of Havre is come back from Flanders, having performed his Commission, which was to appoint the new Magifirates in the feveral Towns of that Province, very much to his Excellency's fatisfaction. The City of Aniwerp has not yet renewed the Impolis upon Wine and Beer; and without their concurrence, the other Towns can conclude nothing in that matter, The Letters from Madrid of the 13th Inflant give us an account, That the King of Spain returned the feventh from Aranjuez, very much indifpoled, That he had been let Blood, and that he was afterwards much better.

Bruffels, Fune 1. On Sunday laff w.s kept the Burghers Annual Feaft; the Magifirates had prayed his Excellency to Honour it with his prefence, and had defigned a great Entertainment for him, but his Excellency would not let them be at that Charge, but did at his own Expence entertain that day the principal of the Nobility, and other Persons of Quality, together with the Magilirates, at Dianer. The fame Evening arrived here his Excellency's Daughter, accompanied with the Counter's of Salazar and Soye, from Spain. We have an account that the Marefchal d'Humietes arrived at Lille on Saturday laft; and Monficur Celbert Mauveurier the fame day at Tourndy; and that the French intend to have three Camps this Summer, the first near Bouchain, the second near Binch, and the third near Conde; and upon these Advices the Marquills de Grana, as we are told, has commanded all Officers to repair immediately to their respective Garifons, and not to fir from thence without particular leave. We have Letters from Madrid, by the way of France; which tell us, That the King of Spain was recovered of his illnefs, and was very well again. From Fienna they write, That the Duke of Lorrain had refolved to attack Gran, or some other place, which he doubled not but to make himfelf Mafter of before the Turks would be in a posture to oppose him, and that for this purpose leveral great Cannon for Battery, and four great Mortar Pieces, had been fenr from Vienna to the Army.

Hague, June 1. The Affair of Surinam is fetled, and Monficur Sommerdyke declared Governot of that Colony, without any dependence upon the West-India Company; He will part very fuddenly, and is to take with him foo Soldiers. Here is arrived the Sieur Swanbielm, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Sueden; from hence he is to b for The Sicur Vander Vecke, the Elector of England. Cologne's Refident, has preferited a Memorial to the States-General, wherein he acquaints them with the League lately concluded at Soef, between the King of Denmark, the Elector of Cologne, the Elector of Brandenburg, and the Bilhop of Munfler, for the defence and lecurity of their respective Dominions; affures them of his Electoral Highnes's Refolution to maintain the Friendlhip and good Correspondence ellablilled between him and this State, and defires them not to interifieddle in the Affairs of Liege, but to withdraw the Troops they have put into the Callie of Horne. We have adrice, That the Count de Roye is arrived at Ham-burgs in Ais Way to Denmark.

Paris, Fune 2. Here have been feveral reports in Town this Week, concer ing the King of Spain's lilnes; The account which the Lettus from Madrid give thereof is, That that Ki g had b 'n ill for leveral days, and that his Diftemper was turned to a Tertian Ague, which was not looked upon to have any danger in it. We are told, That before the Courts Departure from Verfailles a Courier was dispatched with Letters to the Bilhop of Fano, the Pope's Nuncio, wherein he was defiredto remain at Avignon till he should hear farther from his Most Christian Majesty, but having made no flay at Avignon, he did not meet the Courier till after his arrival ar Lyon. Monfieur de St. Romain is preparing for his Embaffy to Portugal.

Windfor, May 24. His Majefty was this day Gracloully pleafed (as a farther mark of His Pavour ) to Confer the Honour of Knighthood upon Mr. Serjeant' Holloway, one of His Majeflies Serjeants at Law.
