King's marks on small arms has been by no means confined to the instance above-mentioned, and having considered it probable that individuals, purchasing arms so marked, may not be aware of the heavy penalties they incur by having such arms in their possession, have thought proper to publish the following abstract of the Acts of Parliament now in force on this subject:

By an Act of Parliament, passed in the 9th and 10th years of the reign of King William 3d, it is enacted, "That all persons in whose possession any military or other stores, marked with the usual marks, shall be found, or who shall conceal such stores (unless such possession is in the usual course of public employment as contractors), shall forfeit such stores and the sum of £200, together with the costs of prosecution, one moiety to His Majesty and the other moiety to the informer; and shall also suffer imprisonment until payment and performance of the said forfeiture, unless such persons shall upon their trial produce a certificate, under the hands of three or more of His Majesty's Principal Officers of the Public Department, expressing the numbers, quantities, or weight of such stores, as they shall then be indicted for, and the reason of such stores coming into their possession."

By an Act passed in the 55th year of the reign of King George the 3d, it is enacted, "That after the passing of that Act, the said Act of the 9th and 10th of King William the 3d; and also the several other Acts of the 9th of King George 1st, the 17th King George 2d, and the 40th King George 3d, so far as they relate to His Majesty's naval, ordnance, and victualling stores, and all the pains, penalties, &c. contained in them, shall extend to all public stores whatsoever, marked with any of the marks specified in the said Acts, or with the broad arrow, and the letters B. O. or with the crown and the broad arrow, or with His Majesty's arms, or with the letters G. R.; and to all persons not authorized to use such marks, or making any goods marked with such marks, and to all persons in whose possession any such stores shall be found, without such certificate, as in the said Act mentioned, or who shall wilfully and fraudulently destroy, take out, or deface such marks, as effectually to all intents and purposes, as if all the penalties and forfeitures, matters and things in the said several Acts contained, so far as the same relate to His Majesty's naval, ordnance, and victualling stores, and the punishment of persons offending in manner therein mentioned, were herein and hereby severally repeated and re-enacted, in respect to all other public stores whatever."

As the imitation of the King's marks, contrary to law, can only be done for purposes of disgraceful imposition, and the practice is as detrimental to His Majesty's service, as it is fraught with danger to individuals. It is the determination of the Master-General and Board to prosecute with the utmost rigor all offenders against the said Acts, and more especially to pursue and bring to justice all persons concerned in illegally marking small arms, or in aiding or abetting the sale thereof.
