7 HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the second day of November next; We, with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said second day of November next, to Tuesday the fourteenth day of November next; and We have given order to Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a writ patent for proroguing the same accordingly; and We do further hereby, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said fourteenth day of November next, be held and sit for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Boroughs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said fourteenth day of November next.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, the first day of September one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, and in the seventh year of Our reign.
