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~** J 12 . * Dantziche He Lettersfrom Warfam of the fourth Inftanc tell us, That the King of Poland does vory much hatten the preparations for the Gampagne, but that it's bylieved he will not have his Forces in a polture to take the Field till the lat-ter end of fuly, or the beginning of August. That the Envoy which Count Teckeley lately feat to that Court, was dilpatched, and that by him the King of Poland had again written to Count Teckeley to I advife him to quit the Engagements he has with the Turks (which in the conclusion will turn to his ruine) and to make his Peace with the Emperor. That the Prince de Lubomirski had taken his leave of the king, to go and command the 6000 Polith Horle and Dragoons which he has railed for the Emperor's fervice; That most of the Palatines were gone from Warfaw to their respective Governments to encourage the new Levies, which are now making in the feveral Provinces of that Kingdom ; and that the Baron de Cracaw Amballador from the Elector of Brandenburg, was upon his departure in order to his return home.

Madrid, May 13. The fifth Inftant the King of Spain found himfelf fomewhat indisposed at Aran juez (where the Court had been for feveral days) and was thereupon perfuaded by his Phylitians to leave that place; and accordingly his Majefty returned hither the leventh about ten in the Morn-The next day he was let Blood, and a feing. cond time on the 10th, and this morning again, and fince his Diffemper (which feemed to be a Tertian Ague) has almost left him, and it's hoped his Majeity will in few days be perfectly well again. Count Mansfeldt the Emperor's Amballador, conti-ues as yet Incognito, expecting the arrival of his Equipage, but that hinders not his receiving the Visits of the principal persons of this Court. Yesterday parted from hence for Liebonne, don Francifco Ablinas, this King's Envoy Extraordinary to the Prince Regent of Portugals Yesterday likewife the Count d'Aguilar begun his journey for Cadiz, to take polleflion of his Command of General of the Armada; it will confift, as we are told, of 26 fix Men of War, and three Fire-fhips, and will be in a condition to put to Sea fome time the next Month; Five and twenty thousand Pistols have been fent from hence to Cadiz for this Service, and other fums will be remitted thicker to haften this Equipage, which it's faid is chiefly made, to affift the Genoucles if there be occasion. We have advice by the way of Barcelona that three Algierine Men of War have lately taken the Captain of Majorca, a Ship of 42 Guns, on board whereof were leveral perfons of quality, as well of Sardagnia as Majorca, who were going for Spain, and

mong outers the Arch-Bilhop of Cagliari, (to whom theiking of Spain had given the ... ihoprick of Auda) and a Lady of the hill quality in Majorca, for whole Ranfom ten thouland Crowns have born already offred by her Relations, but the Moors have refused it. At Cadiz i arrived the Vice-Admiral of the Galeons which thould have come home with the laft fleet, but was forced to dtay behind by an accident the met with, together with another ship; Their Lading is fai to be worth between 3 and 4 Millions of Pieces of Eight.

Gesona, May 14. We are told that the Spa-nifh Refident h re has affured this Senate, That the King his Mafter has fent orders to Cadiz to haften out the Fleee, which he has refolved to have abroad this Summer for the focurity of this State. The Soldiers that have been railed to ferve on board the four new Gallies, are arrived here, and the faid Gallies will now very fuddenly be in a condition to Sail. The Senate have fent fome money to Savona, for the carrying on the new Fortificationsthey are making there. On Wednelday laft arrived here an Express in four days from Paris, with Letters to Monfieur de St. Olon , the French Refid_nt here. We are told that the Senate are treating with the Governor of Milas for a Regim at of Foot, which they are delirous to have pals into their Service; and inflead thereof that Governor will, they fay, raile a Regiment of Suiffers.

Venice; May 15. On Monday last the Senate received advice by an Express, That the Sieur Sar gredo Captain of the Golfe, had taken near Ancona, a Pirate of Dulcigno (who had fome days b fore landed near Sinigaglia, and carried away feveral of the Country People") after a very tharp Fight for feveral hours in which the Sieur Sagredo loft leveral men, and was himfelf wounded The Princes of Newburg intend to part hence on Monday next for Germany. Some Greeks, who came hither this Week, inform us that the Fortress of Zigeth b:** longing to the Turks, was lately blown up with the great Magazine they had there, and that there was a report that a Croat, who had fome time bet fore put himfelf into the Service of the Turks, has fethro to the faid Magazine, but that the general belief was it happened by Lightning. The Letters from Rome of the eighth Inflant inform us, That the Bilhop of Fano had orders to haften his four+ ney that he might be at Paris before his most Chriflian Majefty begins his Progress. That the Pope had by an Express received an account from his Nuncio at Kienna, of the conclusion of the League between the Emperor and that Crown; and that th faid League sto be form at Rome by Cardinal Pio on brhalf of the Emperor, and Cardinal Barba-nin in the name of the King of Palander
