NOTICE is hereby given, that His Majesty will hold a Levee at St. James's-Palace, on Monday next the 27th instant, at two o'clock.

AT the Court at *St. James's*, the 20th of November 1826,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the third of May last, for prohibiting the exportation of gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar), has expired; and whereas it is judged expedient that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service), do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the date of this Order), presume to transport any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar) or ship or lade any gun-

powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf, first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Second, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the exportation of gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammunition, and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying coastwise of salt-petre, gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammunition;" and also by an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of His late Majesty's reign, cap. 2, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the exportation of naval stores, and more effectually to prevent the exportation of salt-petre, arms, and ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council:"

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by His Majesty's Order in Council, dated nineteenth July one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, and by the second section of the said Order, it is, amongst other things, directed, that such of certain vessels therein more particularly described, as are or shall be bound to any port in Ireland between Missen Head and Tuskard, shall perform quarantine in the Bay of Baltimore; such of them as are or shall be bound to any port between Tuskard and Rathlin, shall perform quarantine in Lough Larne and the Bay of Carlingford, near Killoween Point, opposite the Town of Carlingford; such of them as are or shall be bound to any port between Rathlin and Tory Island, shall perform quarantine in Ballymastoker Bay or Red Castle Road, near Londonderry; such of them as are bound for any port between Tory Island and Blacksod Bay, shall perform quarantine in the Harbour of Killybegs; such of them as shall be bound for any port between Blacksod Bay and Loop Head, shall perform quarantine in Clew Bay, otherwise called the Bay of Burrishowle; and lastly, such of them as shall be bound for any port between Loop Head and Missen Head, shall perform quarantine in Scattery Bay, in the River of Limerick; it is hereby ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that so much of the said Order in Council be, and the same is, hereby revoked.

And His Majesty is pleased to order, by and with the advice aforesaid, that all such ships or vessels liable to quarantine, as are or shall be bound to any port in Ireland, with clean bills of health, and not having on board any of the articles enumerated in the thirty-first section of the said Order in Council, dated the nineteenth July one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, shall perform quarantine at one of the following stations, that is to say,

Poolbeg, in the Harbour of Dublin;
Warren Point, in the Harbour of Newry;
Near Gramoye, in the Harbour of Belfast;
Tarbert, in the River Shannon, in the Harbour of Limerick;
Baltimore;
Passage, River Suir, in the Harbour of Waterford;
White Gate, Cove of Cork;
Green Castle, Lough Foyle; and
Black Rock, Galway Bay.

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, by and with the advice aforesaid, that all ships or vessels, with clean bills of health, having on board any of the articles enumerated in the said thirty-first section of the said Order in Council, and intending to import the same into any port in Ireland, shall repair either to White Gate or Gramoye aforesaid, to perform quarantine.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. *C. C. Greville.*

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that between eleven and twelve o'clock in the night of Sunday the 5th instant, James Forster, a seaman of His Majesty's ship Hyperion, which is stationed on the coast of Sussex for the prevention of smuggling, being on his duty as a sentinel at the Blackhorse-lane, near East Elmer, in the said county, was attacked by a party of men concealed behind a wall, who pelted him with stones, one of which having struck him on the face and brought him to the ground, three of the said party advanced upon him, seized him, dragged him into the lane, and there with a knife cut off part of his right ear, broke two of his fingers, made several stabs at him through his clothes, and attempted to cut his throat, which was prevented by his getting his hand to his pistol and firing an alarm, on which they made off and escaped;

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to justice the offenders concerned in this atrocious felony, is hereby pleased to promise his most gracious pardon to any one of the said offenders (except those who actually wounded the said James Forster) who shall make known his accomplices therein, so that they may be apprehended.

British vessels, and foreign vessels entitled to the privilege of reciprocity in respect of charges, are exempt from toll when navigated wholly in ballast.

GRANT to the ARMY which served under the Command of LIEUTENANT-GENERAL SIR THOMAS HISLOP, Bart. G.C.B. in the WAR against the PINDAREES and certain of the MAHRATTA STATES, in the Years 1817 and 1818.
