NOTICE is hereby given, that His Majesty will hold a Levee at St. James's-Palace, on Monday next the 27th instant, at two o'clock.

St. James's, November 21, 1826.

THIS day His Majesty proceeded in state from St. James's-Palace to the House of Peers, where he arrived ten minutes before two o'clock; and, having alighted from the state coach, was received at the portico by the Great Officers of State and others, and proceeded to the robing-room in the customary manner, wearing a cap of estate adorned with jewels: the sword of state being borne by the Earl of Liverpool, K. G.

His Majesty was there robed, and having put on the imperial crown, the procession moved into the House in the usual order.

His Majesty being seated upon the Throne, the Great Officers of State and others standing on the right and left, Sir Thomas Tyrwhitt, Knt. Gentleman, Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to deliver the following most gracious Speech to both Houses of Parliament:

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

I HAVE called you together at this time for the

special purpose of communicating to you the measure which I judged it necessary to take, in the month of September, for the admission into the ports of the United Kingdom of certain sorts of foreign grain, not then admissible by law.

I have directed a copy of the Order in Council issued on that occasion to be laid before you, and I confidently trust that you will see sufficient reason for giving your sanction to the provisions of that Order, and for carrying them into effectual execution.

I have great satisfaction in being able to inform you, that the hopes entertained at the close of the last session of Parliament, respecting the termination of the war in the Burmese territories, have been fulfilled, and that a peace has been concluded in that quarter, highly honourable to the British arms and to the councils of the British Government in India.

I continue to receive from all Foreign Powers assurances of their earnest desire to cultivate the relations of peace and friendly understanding with Me.

I am exerting Myself with unremitting anxiety, either singly or in conjunction with My Allies, as well to arrest the progress of existing hostilities, as to prevent the interruption of peace in different parts of the world.

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

I have directed the estimates for the ensuing year to be prepared, and they will, in due time, be laid before you.

I will take care that they shall be formed with as

much attention to economy as the exigencies of the public service will permit.

The distress which has pervaded the commercial and manufacturing classes of My subjects, during the last twelve months, has affected some important branches of the revenue; but I have the satisfaction of informing you, that there has been no such diminution in the internal consumption of the country, as to excite any apprehensions that the great sources of our wealth and prosperity have been impaired.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

I have deeply sympathized with the sufferings which have been, for some time past, so severely felt in the manufacturing districts of this country; and I have contemplated with great satisfaction the exemplary patience with which those sufferings have been generally borne.

The depression under which the trade and manufactures of the country have been labouring has abated more slowly than I had thought Myself warranted in anticipating; but I retain a firm expectation that this abatement will be progressive, and that the time is not distant when, under the blessing of Divine Providence, the commerce and industry of the United Kingdom will have resumed their wonted activity.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the third of May last, for prohibiting the exportation of gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Straights of Gibraltar), has expired; and whereas it is judged expedient that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service), do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the date of this Order), presume to transport any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Straights of Gibraltar) or ship or lade any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any such ports or places

on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf, first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Second, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the exportation of gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammunition, and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying coastwise of salt-petre, gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammunition;" and also by an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of His late Majesty's reign, cap. 2, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the exportation of naval stores, and more effectually to prevent the exportation of salt-petre, arms, and ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council."

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by His Majesty's Order in Council, dated nineteenth July one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, and by the second section of the said Order, it is, amongst other things, directed, that such of certain vessels therein more particularly described, as are or shall be bound to any port in Ireland between Missen Head and Tuskard, shall perform quarantine in the Bay of Baltimore; such of them as are or shall be bound to any port between Tuskard and Rathlin, shall perform quarantine in Lough Larne and the Bay of Carlingford, near Killoween Point, opposite the Town of Carlingford; such of them as are or shall be bound to any port between Rathlin and Tory Island, shall perform quarantine in Ballymastoker Bay or Red Castle Road, near Londonderry; such of them as are bound for any port between Tory Island and Blacksod Bay, shall perform quarantine in the Harbour of Killybeggs; such of them as shall be bound for any port between Blacksod Bay and Loop Head, shall perform quarantine in Clew Bay, otherwise called the Bay of Barrishowle; and lastly, such of them as shall be bound for any port between Loop Head and Missen Head, shall perform quarantine in Scattery Bay, in the River of Limerick; it is hereby ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that so

much of the said Order in Council be, and the same is, hereby revoked.

And His Majesty is pleased to order, by and with the advice aforesaid, that all such ships or vessels liable to quarantine, as are or shall be bound to any port in Ireland, with clean bills of health, and not having on board any of the articles enumerated in the thirty-first section of the said Order in Council, dated the nineteenth July one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, shall perform quarantine at one of the following stations, that is to say,

Poolbeg, in the Harbour of Dublin;
Warren Point, in the Harbour of Newry;
Near Gramoyle, in the Harbour of Belfast;
Tarbert, in the River Shannon, in the Harbour of Limerick;
Baltimore;
Passage, River Suir, in the Harbour of Waterford;
White Gate, Cove of Cork;
Green Castle, Lough Foyle; and
Black Rock, Galway Bay.

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, by and with the advice aforesaid, that all ships or vessels, with clean bills of health, having on board any of the articles enumerated in the said thirty-first section of the said Order in Council, and intending to import the same into any port in Ireland, shall repair either to White Gate or Gramoyle aforesaid, to perform quarantine.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

Trinity-House, London, November 16, 1826.
