

That matters there continue still in very great disorder, the Commonalty having refused to let at liberty the Syndick Judendock, and several of the Magistrates, whom they lately Imprisoned.

Brussels, June 9. This day arriv'd here from *England* the Lord *Lansdowne*, Eldest Son to the Earl of *Bath*, accompanied with several English Gentlemen, in his Journey to *Vienna*, where he expects to meet his younger Brother, Mr. *John Greenville*, (who comes from his Studies at *Angers* in *France*) that they may pass together to the Imperial Army in *Hungary*, to serve as Volunteers in the present War against the *Turks*. The Camp which the Marquis de *Grana* is forming at *Peison* will only consist of four or five Thousand Men, as well Horse as Dragoons; It is said he will have an other near *Aeth*, which may joyn together if there be occasion. The States of *Namur* have sent Deputies hither to acquaint his Excellency, That the Way which they have undertaken, at his Excellencies desire, to make between *Namur* and *Genap*, is near finished, and to pray that the like diligence may be us'd in the making that between this City and *Genap*. His Excellency having received directions from *Spain* to let the King's Demelins in these Countreys to Farm, in the same manner as the Customs have been Lett, publick Notice has been given thereof, that such persons as are desirous to be concerned therein may give in their Proposals. A Gentleman is arriv'd here from the Prince of *Luxemburg*, to compliment their Excellencies upon their Marriage, and the like Compliment has been made them by Monsieur *Hulff*, in the name of the Prince and Princess of *Orange*. Don *Balthazar de Fuen Mayor*, the Spanish Envoy at the *Hague*, continues still here.

Hague, June 15. The Prince of *Orange* has been at *Maesland-Sluice*, to visit the Men of War which the Admiralty of the *Mæse* is fitting out there, and his Highness is gone to *Amsterdam*, to see likewise the Equipage that is making there, which as we understand is in good forwardness; of the nine Ships that are fitted out by that Admiralty, six have already passed the *Pampus*, and the other three will do it in few days. The Count de *Stirum* is to command this Squadron in stead of Lieutenant Admiral *Tromp*, who demanded several things which the States and the Prince of *Orange* did not think fit to grant. The Pensionary *Fagel* continues very much indisposed.

Paris, June 16. His Most Christian Majesty is now at his Camp on the *Soane*, but as yet we have not any particulars of what has passed there. We have advice, That the French Gallies which were forced by the late bad Weather to put into Port again, have been met in the Gulf of *Lyons*, but it is not said what course they took; neither have we any News of Monsieur du *Quefne*. It is reported, That the Mirquis d'*Amsreville* has, after a stout resistance, taken another Ship belonging to *Genoua*, though bearing Spanish Colours. The Pope's Nuncio is arriv'd at *Orleans*, and is to continue there until His Majesty's return from *Asia*. During the King's stay in *Asia* the Dutchess of *Orleans* will make a visit to her Brother; the Elector Palatine, who has appointed to meet her at *Keserlautern*.

Plymouth, June 5. On Friday last Sailed from thence His Majesty's Ship the *Dover*, and the *Dept-*

ford Ketch, with several Merchant Ships bound for the *Streights*.
