WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto the King, that, in the night of the 16th ultimo, a firing having been heard to proceed from a game cover, belonging to Joseph Legh, Esq. of High Legh, in the county of Chester, Thomas Sothorn, gamekeeper of R. E. E. Warburton, Esq. to whom the adjoining manor of Appleton belongs, and his assistants were proceeding towards the said cover, and while in a field in the said manor of Appleton, and endeavouring to apprehend several poachers whom they there saw, the said Thomas Sothorn was severely beaten, and Daniel Brooks, one of his assistants, received a gun-shot wound, of which he died;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the felony above mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually fired the said gun) who shall discover his accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
