THE Commander in Chief has been pleased to appoint Lieutenant-General Sir Herbert Taylor to be his Military Secretary.

Whitehall, January 23, 1827.

The King has been pleased to present the Reverend Peter Buchanan to the church and parishes of Stichill and Hume, in the presbytery of Kelso, and counties of Berwick and Roxburgh, vacant by the death of the Reverend Andrew Scott, late Minister there.

Whitehall, January 25, 1827.

The King has been pleased to give and grant unto Sir Edwyn-Francis Stanhope, of Holme Lacy, in the county of Hereford, and late of Stanwell-house, in the county of Middlesex, only son and heir of Admiral Sir Henry-Edwyn Stanhope, of Stanwell aforesaid, Bart. who was son of Edwyn-Francis Stanhope, also of Stanwell, Esq. sometime one of the Equerries to Her Majesty Queen Charlotte, consort of His late Most Excellent Majesty King George the Third, of blessed memory (by Catherine Brydges his wife), which Edwyn-Francis Stanhope was the only issue of Charles Stanhope, Esq. great grandson of Philip Stanhope, first Earl of Chesterfield, all deceased, His royal licence and authority, that he and his issue may (with a view of perpetuating his descent from, as well as of testifying his regard for the ancient family of Scudamore, of Holme Lacy, the greater part of whose ample inheritance devolved upon him on the death of the late Francess Duchess of Norfolk, as one of the coheirs and representatives of James Viscount Scudamore, ancestor of the said Duchess of Norfolk) assume and use the surname of Scudamore, in addition to and before that of Stan-

hope, and also bear the arms of Scudamore, quarterly in the second quarter with those of his own family; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office, otherwise His Majesty's said royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect.

And also to order, that the said royal concession and declaration be recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms.

CHAPLAINS' BOUNTY.

THE Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed money for the payment of half-pay to Sea Officers, from the 1st October to the 31st December last, according to His Majesty's establishment in that behalf; these are to give notice, that the several payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office, by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, at ten o'clock in the morning, on the following days, viz.

On the 5th, 6th, and 7th of February, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies.

On the 8th, 9th, 12th, 13th, and 14th of February, to Lieutenants and Chaplains, and their Attornies.

On the 15th and 16th of February, to Masters, Surgeons, and Pursers, and their Attornies.

After which the lists will be recalled the first and third Wednesday in every month, that all persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them, and bring with them an affidavit as required by Order in Council of 30th July 1819, the forms of which were published in an advertisement from this Office, dated 16th September 1819, and may be procured at the Office of the Treasurer of the Navy; and in case any of the said Officers should not be able to attend themselves, but employ Attornies for that purpose, the said Attornies are to produce similar affidavits from the persons they are employed by.

Where Officers are abroad on leave, their agents are to produce attested copies of such leave, before the half-pay can be paid.

And as by Act of Parliament, passed in the thirty-fifth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious method for the payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the twentieth clause of the said Act, "that if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive half-pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near the place of his residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, in London, to have such half-pay paid at or near the place of his residence, &c. in the manner pointed out by the said Act;" and by a further Act, passed in the fifty-sixth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for enabling the Officers in His Majesty's Navy, and their representatives, to draw for and receive their half-pay," it is enacted by the first and third clauses of the said Act, "that if any Officer in His Majesty's Navy, who shall be entitled to receive any sum of money for or on account of his half-pay, shall be desirous of drawing a bill of exchange for the same upon the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy, instead of receiving the same by remittance bill, he shall signify such desire, by letter, to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy; and that if any Officer in His Majesty's Navy, who shall be entitled to receive any sum of money for or on account of half-pay, shall be desirous of having his half-pay paid to him by extract at any of His Majesty's Dock-Yards where Clerks for the payment of wages for the Navy shall reside, instead of receiving the same by remittance bill or bill of exchange, he is to apply either to the proper Clerk, at the Navy Pay-Office, in London, or at the Pay-Office at such Dock-Yard, signifying such his desire;" notice is hereby further given, that the half-pay ending the 31st December last, will commence paying on the 5th February next; and all persons desirous of drawing for or of having their half-pay remitted to them, may apply as above directed.

"To the Honourable the Court of Directors of the East India Company.

"We, the undersigned Proprietors of India Stock, duly qualified, request that a Court of Proprietors may soon be called, to which it is our intention to submit the following Propositions:

"1st. To deliberate on the present state of the Oriental education, connected with the absolute necessity for the whole of the Company's servants in Hindoostan to acquire at least some colloquial knowledge of its popular tongue.

"2d. To determine whether the elementary acquisition of Hindoostanee in this country be not indispensable to candidates for official appointments previous to their nomination by the Court of Directors, in order so far to secure the future good government of British India, and the durable prosperity of that vast empire.

"3d. To decide also on the propriety of the proposed preliminary qualification for free merchants, mariners, and others, before granting them a licence to reside among a hundred millions of native subjects, in daily contact with those European inhabitants, who in general know nothing of the Hindoostanee, and consequently may injuriously impede, through the multitarious transactions of public or private life, not only the local Authorities, but the common weal of the People and State.

"4th. For a copy of the regulations issued by the Court of Directors relative to the public examinations at home or abroad of persons intended for the Company's service in India, on their respective acquirements as Oriental scholars with the view of securing efficient servants for the effectual management of numerous important affairs in our extensive and extending domains in the East.

"5th. To compare the real expence of the two systems of Oriental tuition existing here since 1818, with the notorious disproportionate results of each, the total charge of one mode of Oriental instruction alone having amounted to £64,000 for 560 students, while that of the other was only £4,000, for communicating similar information to 1,600 pupils, at the Hindoostanee and Persian Lecture-rooms in London, many of whom are now not only very useful Interpreters, &c., but able and ready to execute other responsible functions in the East Indian service.

"6th. To recommend the adoption of some plan here for the immediate encouragement of appropriate military education and Oriental literature,

with colloquial proficiency among the King's Officers, the Company's Cavalry, and Infantry Cadets, &c., to the serious attention of the Executive Court, which has done nothing yet to enable those youths to proceed hence as Officers or Linguists to India, well qualified to command numerous bodies of brave men, by speaking the most current local dialect, and being at the same time as well instructed as the engineer and artillery students have long been at Addescombe, in those arts of war and tactical exercises inseparable from the due performance of their respective duties in the Indian army."
