Moscow, May 2.

ALL things continue quiet here. Next Week the Swedish Envoy parts hence for *Stockholm*, having finished his Negotiation in this Court to his satisfaction, and the Czars have resolved to send an Extraordinary Ambassador to the King of Sweden, to adjust the differences concerning the Frontiers, which were left undecided by the Commissioners of both Crowns.

Leghorn, May 31. The 26th instant arrived here the *Genova Merchant*, Captain *Appleby* Commander, in 18 days from *Lisbonne*. It is said, the Grand Duke intends to fit out several Gallies very suddenly, to be employed against the Turkish Corsairs, who do infest these Seas. Captain *Pieterfon* is sailed from hence for *Tripoly*, to negotiate a Peace between the States General and that Government. It is said, That the French Fleet under the command of Monsieur *du Quesne*, is gone for *A'giers*.

From the Imperial Camp near *Comorra*, June 3. The 28th past the Duke of *Lorraine* marched with in sight of *Gran*, with 8000 Horse, 4000 Foot, all the Dragoons and 8 Pieces of Cannon, and finding the Turks so advantageously Posted upon an Eminence near that place, that he could not without great hazard attack them, returned hither again, and as is said has given Orders for the Cavalry to pass the *Danube* to morrow, in order to invest *Newbusei*, two Leagues from hence; All the Army is preparing for the Siege, and it is hoped his Highness, by means of his great Ordnance and Bombs, will in a short time be Master of the place. Count *Teckelej* is still Encamped near *Tockay*, declining to joyn his Troops with those of the Turks. We have advice by a Deserter, who is fled to the Imperial Camp from *Buda*, That the Grand Vizier had not, as yet passed the River *Drave*, That his Army was extremely harassed and weakened, by reason of the long Marches they have been obliged to make; and that the Vizier of *Buda* was very advantageously Posted between *Gran* and *Buda*, where he had a Bridge of Boats for the passage of the Turkish Troops.

Presbourg, June 1. The Vizier of *Buda* has sent Orders to Count *Teckely* to joyn the *Tatars*, which are on their march to *Hungary*, by the way of *Transylvania*; wherein it is not doubted but he will be prevented by General *Schutz*, who is posted near *Transbin* and will be reinforced with the 6000 Poles, which the Prince of *Lubomirsky* is bringing into the Emperor's service. We are told, That he has taken possession of the County of *Arwa* in his Imperial Majesties name, and that the Nobility thereof are joyned with him. Our advices from the Imperial Camp say, That a Body of 15000 Turks are posted near *Gran*. And it is reported, That the Vizier of *Buda* had sent to acquaint the Duke of *Lorraine*, That the Grand Signior

was resolved to observe the Peace until its due expiration; but that his Highness had returned answer, That the Turks had long ago broke it, as well by their open assisting of the Rebel; several places of importance belonging to the Empour.

Vienna, June 6. The three Princes of *Newbourg* have been taken very ill upon their return from *Italy*, and on Friday last Prince *Wolfgang*, who was Canon of *Bresslaw*, dyed at *Newstadt*. The first Instant the Duke of *Lorraine* returned to his Camp near *Comorra*, not having been able to remove the Turks from the advantageous Post they had taken near *Gran*, whither the Vizier of *Buda* and the Bassa of *Waradin* had sent a considerable number of Troops to reinforce the Garrison. The fourth Instant the Imperial Army passed the *Danube*. The Duke of *Lorraine* has sent out a considerable Party to attempt the burning of the Bridge of *Gran*. The Count de *Serin*, Governor of *Zatmar*, being arrived here from *Hungary*, is gone to attend the Emperor at *Luxembourg*. Yesterday arrived here an Express with Letters from the Baron de *Saponara*, who is employed by the Emperor to Count *Teckelej*.

Copenhagen, June 11. The Heer *Guldenlieu* is returned to his Government of *Norway*, to observe the motions of the Swedes on that side, who, as our Letters from *Stockholm* say, are bringing together a Body of 10000 men on that Frontier; and use all possible diligence in fitting out their Fleet to Sea, which, according to our advices from *Calmar*, will consist of 30 Men of War.

Brussels, June 12. On Sunday next his Excellency intends to go and view the Camp which is forming at *Pieton*. The French Cavalry which were Quartered near *Markion* decamped the eighth Instant, and are now Posted near *Bouchain*. The States of *Haynault* have received Orders from his Excellency to repair the Ways between the *Sambre* and the *Meuse*. The French intend to have a Camp at *la Buchierre*, to observe the design of that which our Governor has formed at *Pieton*. On Saturday last the Dutchess of *Bouillon* arrived here from *France*, and yesterday parted hence for *Holland*. All things are as yet very quiet in these parts. The Duke of *Havre* and the Count de *Vervain* are returned hither from *Flanders*, whither his Excellency sent them to renew the Magistrates of the several Towns in that Province. The Magistrates of *Antwerp* have not as yet consented to the continuation of the Taxes demanded by his Excellency.

Brussels, June 15. Sunday last being the Emperor's Birth-day, his Excellency entertained the Court with a most magnificent Supper and Ball. Yesterday the Lord *Lansdown* parted from hence towards *Hungary*, with a very noble Equipage, having been very well received by his Excellency, and Complimented by all the Generals and the Nobility
