Dantzick, June 3.

Ur Letters from Warfan tell us, That the 28th paft the Marguifs de Vitry, Ambaslador from the Most Chriftian King, had his Andience of Leave of the King and Senate of Poland, in order to his return home; That the Cham of Tartary had font an Envoy to the King of Poland to inform him of his arrival at *Faffe*, the Capital City of *Walachid*, and that he was continuing his March towards Hungary, with 'a very confiderable Body of Horf:, in order to joyn the Troops of the Grand-Vizier at Belgrade. The fam: Letters ad 1, That the Imperial Minister at Warfaw had received Bills of Exchange for One hundred thousand Ducats which are to be paid unto the King of Po and, in confideration of the Forces, he is obliged to fend into the Emperor's Service, in purfuance of the Treaty Concluded between them; That the Pr. parations for the War are carried on with all poffible diligence and vigor, and it is not doubted but the King of Poldad will take the Field with his Army about the latter end of this Month.

Comora, June 4. The 2 Inflant 3 Regiments of Imperial Dragoons and a confide, able Party of Horfe palled the Danube and the Wuag, and yefterday, morning invefted Newbeufel, and took a great number of Cattel in the adjacent Fiells, which the Turks had left feeding there, believing that the Imperialists were employed in the Siege of Gran, whither the Baffa of Newbeufel, upon the first notice he had of the Duke of Lorrain's turning that way, had fent a confiderable quantity of Ammunition, under a Convoy of 800 Horfe. This day the reft of the Infantry marched towards Newbeufel, whither the great Cannon, which is to be employed on the Batteries, will be fent to morrow.

cd on the Batteries, will be fent to morrow. From the Imperial Camp before Newheufel, Fune 8. The Duke of Lorrain being arrived the 4th Inflant b. fore this place, commanded 1000 Men to attack an our-Fort, which they accordingly did that Afternoon, and took ir. Yefferday we took the lower Town, a great part whereof the Vice-Baffa has burnt, and is retired into the chief Fortrefs, where he is preparing for a Vigorous defence. We loft in the firft action 20 Men, and amongft them the Count de Taffis, brother to the Prince de la Tour, who was killed by a Janizary. This Evening we thall have three Batteries ready to play upon the Fortrefs, and hope to be Mafters of the Counterfcarp as this day. Our Army is Poffed on both fides of the River of Neutra. Yefterday being Whit-Sunday we began to throw our Bombs, and to batter the place with our great Guns. The Vice-Baffa, after having fent an Offieer to the Duke of Lorrain, to acquaint him, That he wondred he would by acts of Hoftility engage the Emperor and the Grand-Signior in a Quarred,

and break the Peace, which as-yet ought to be obferved between them, caufed two white Flags and a red one to be hung out upon the higheft Tower of the Fortrefs. The Party which the Duke of Lorrain fent towards Gran have fucceeded in their attempt, having burnt the Bridge of Boats which when Turks had laid over the Danube, and thereby prevented them from advancing towards our Camp. The Batta of Nembeufel (who was abroad when the place was invefted) not being able to get in, is retired to Gran.

get in, is retired to Gran. *Vienna June* 10. Yeherday being the Emperor's Birth-day, was observed here with great solemnity. Oui Letters from the Imperial Camp fay, That the Duke of Lorrain had befieged the Fortress of New-beulel, That he was already Master of the lower City, and hoped in a short time to compel the Turks to Surrender the Fortress, they having no expectation of R lief. On Monday la t the Nobility of the Country of Presh.nrg, to the aumber of 3000 Horfe, joyned the Army before Newbeufel, Captain Crauz, and some other Officers in Coult Starenberg's Regiment of Foot, were flain in the Attack of the Lower-City.

in the Attack of the Lower-City. Copenbagen, June 12. The froops in the Provinc's of Funen and Julland have Orders to march forthwith for Holflein: The King's forfe Guards are already parted from hence for Flensbourg, where they are to flay till his Majeflies arrival. One thousand Scamen are arrived here, and 1500 more are expected for the Service of the Fleet. His Majffly has Llued out a Proclamation, commanding all his Subjects that have taken Service on Board the Ships of any Foreign Prince or State, to repair home immediately upon pain of Death. The King of Sucken has fent 300 Men to reinforce the Garifon of Wilmar.

the Garifon of Wifmar. Elfineur, fune 16. Two days agoe 18 Danilh Men of War came into this Road, and Sailed back again to Copenbagen without calling Anchor. It is believed, the King of Denmark was on Board them.

The 12th luftant the Ele-Ctor of Bavdria paffed through this place, in his return home : He has appointed a general Rendezvous of his Troops at Herfebfeldt, near Ausburg. The States-General of the United Provinces have ordered their Minifter here to go to Munick, to ad, uff fome matters with his Electoral Highnels, with relation to the Treaty of Guatanty between him and the faid States. The Electoral Colledge have not as yet given an Answer to the Propoz fals made unto them by the Colledge of the Princes. The States of Swaben are affembled at Ulm, to confider of the belt means for the def nee of that Circle in the prefent juncture of Affairs, and havemade a confiderable progress in the matters depending before them.

Cologne, June 11. From Munick they write, That the Elector of Bawaria has appointed a Rendezvous of the Troops of that Circle, to be held, near near Herfebfeldt, and that he will himfalf b prefent at it; and from Francfors we have an account, That the Baron of Werdenaw was on the 3 t paft Elefted Bifhop of Wirtsburg, and the Baron, of Staufemberg Bilhop of Bamberg. The Commonalty here continue in Arms, and their Leaders have taken upon them to examine the Sieur-Judendoneke and the Sieur Heffelman, who are their Ptifoners, and to give Orders for the framing a Process againft Collonel Cirpricht, who commanded the Miditia, and what thefe fumults and Diforders will end in nobody can fuy.

end in nobody can fuy. Hamburg Fune 15. The Letters from Copenbagen fay, 1 hat the King of Denmark intends to begin his Journ of towards Halfein on the 21 Inflant, and that the King of Studden was fending 18 Regiments to reinforce his Garifons in Schmen. The new Fortifications that are making here are continued with all imaginable diligence and application. We are told. That the El. cor of Saxony, the Dukes of Brunfwick and Lunenburg, and the Landgrave of Heffe, have entred into an Alliance for the Security and Defence of the upper and lower Saxony. It is faid, That the Electors of Saxony and Bavaria are to have an Interview at Drefden.

Brussels, June 22. Our Letters from the Imperial Camp before Newheusel of the eighth Instant fay, That it was invested the second Instant; That the fourth the Duke of Lorrain arrived with his whole Army and Cannon before the place, and that the Turks finding he was refolved to attack it, burnt the Suburbs, and retired into the Cittadel; That the Imperialists, in taking a small Out-work, had loft 16 or 17 Voluntiers, persons of Quality, among whom was Count Ambony de Tass, younger Brother to the Prince de la Tour, and that about 20 more were wounded. The Letters add, That the Befiegers had three Batteries playing, and were advanced fo near as to be lodged under the Counterfcarp, which they intended to attack that night, and doubted not of being Mafters of the place within few days.

Bruffels, June 23. Yefterday his Excellency went to visit the Camp at Pieton which confilts of 4000 Horfe, under the Command of the Prince de Vaudemont, as General. Befides these there are in feveral Garifons about 2000 difmounted Covalry, for whom his Excellency is providing Horfes. Next Week their Exceller cies intend to go to Englien, and from thence to Marimont. We hope our next Letters from *Vienna* will bring us the good News of the taking of *Newbeufel*, which the Turks have not Forces enough in the Field to relieve, the main Body of the Ottoman Army being not expected in *Hungary* till the beginning of the next Month. There are Letters which (ay, That the Dorkith Army will confift of vaft numbers, fome Tpeaking of 300000 Men, and these commanded by 77 Basfa's, but that they are raw and unexperienced, drawn together from all parts of the Empire, and that they are extreamly harraffed with their long Marches.

Hague, June 22. The Count de Carellon, natural Son to the late King of Sueden, is arrived here, and as it's faid is to be Collonel of the Walloon Regiment in the Strike of the States, in the room of Baron Span, who is lately dead at Stockbolm. Yefferday the Priace of Orange returned to Honflaerdyke from North-Holland, being very well fatisfied with the foryvardneis in which he found the Ships that are fitted out by that Admiralty. It is confidently reported, That the Prince of Naffaw, Governor of Frizeland and Groningen, is to be Marryed to the Princes of Ambalt. Yelterday-the-Sieurs Nottegen and Roy arrived here, being fent by the Duke of Newbourg to follicite the Payment of the Arrears of Subhdies which are due unto him flom this State. Our Letters-from Cologne fay, That affairs continue flill in the fame Confusion; but that-there is great hop s that the differences depending between that Elector and the City of Liege may be fpeedily composed. The News of the Town is, That Monficur du Quesse is arrived with the Fleet under his Command before Algiers; and that the Spaniards have refuied him the use of their Ports. We are told, That the Nuncio is parted from Orleans, having received by an Express polytive Orders from the Pope to repair without further delay to the French Court, and demand an Audience of his Majelty. The Archbilhop of Rheims, Brother to Monfieur de Louvois, is very dangeroully fick.
