AT the Court at *St. James's*, the 14th day of *March* 1827,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS in and by a certain Act of Parliament, made and passed in the fifth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend and consolidate the laws relating to the abolition of the slave trade," parts of the net proceeds of ships and cargoes taken and condemned for illegal trading in slaves, as therein provided, and also certain bounties and other sums of money therein specified, are made payable to the Commanders, Officers, and crews of such of His Majesty's ships as shall seize and capture the same, subject to such distribution as His Majesty shall think fit and direct by any Order in Council to be made for that purpose:

In pursuance of the powers so given, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and direct, and it is hereby ordered and directed, that all and every the proceeds, bounties, and other sums of money, which have become payable as aforesaid, and remain undistributed, or which shall become payable as aforesaid under and by virtue of the said recited Act, subject to such order of distribution so to be made as aforesaid, shall be distributed and divided amongst the captors or seizors thereof, in such manner, form, and proportion, and according to such rules and regulations as are directed and provided by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the twenty-third of June one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, for the distribution of the shares of any such seizures as are and shall, by virtue of any Acts relating to the trade and revenues of His Majesty's dominions, be payable to and amongst the Commanders, Officers, and crews of any of His Majesty's ships:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commis-

sioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-seventh year of His late Majesty's reign, cap. 57, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to suspend training and regulate the quotas of the militia," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by any Order or Orders in Council, to suspend the calling out of the militia of the United Kingdom, or any part of the United Kingdom, or of any county, riding, shire, stewartry, city, town, or place, for the purpose of being trained and exercised in any year, and to order and direct that no training or exercising of the militia of the United Kingdom, or of any part of the United Kingdom, or of any county or counties, riding or ridings, shire or shires, stewartry or stewartries, city or cities, town or towns, or place or places, specified in any such Order or Orders in Council, shall take place in any year, any thing contained in any Act or Acts of Parliament relating to the militia to the contrary notwithstanding: and whereas it is deemed expedient, that such training or exercising should be dispensed with in the present year; it is ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the calling out of the militia of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain, for the purpose of being trained and exercised in the present year, be suspended; and that no training or exercising of the said militia do take place in the present year.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the third of May last, for prohibiting the exportation of gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar), has expired; and whereas it is judged expedient that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service), do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the date of this Order), presume to transport any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar) or ship or lade any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Second, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the exportation of gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammunition, and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying coastwise of salt-petre, gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammunition;" and also by an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of His late Majesty's reign, cap. 2, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the exportation of naval stores, and more effectually to prevent the exportation of salt-petre, arms, and ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council."

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. *Jas. The humble Address of the Moderator and Remanent Members of the Presbytery of Lochcarron.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Reverend the Presbytery of Lochcarron, in Presbytery assembled, participating deeply in the sorrow which pervades all classes of your Majesty's subjects, on the melancholy event of the death of His Royal Highness the Duke of York, beg leave to approach the Throne with the most profound respect, and to express our sympathy and sincere condolence with your Majesty on this afflictive bereavement, by which your Majesty has lost a Brother endeared to you, not only by the tender ties of blood and fraternal affection, but also by a long, warm, and uninterrupted friendship, which had knit together your congenial and kindred hearts.

When we consider the warm and steady attachment uniformly manifested by His Royal Highness to the British Constitution, in Church and State, and the successful resistance which he opposed to every measure which had a tendency to weaken or endanger the Protestant Ascendancy; when we reflect on the zeal, assiduity, and impartiality which he displayed in the exercise of his important office as Commander in Chief of your Majesty's land forces; and on the beneficial and important changes which he effected in the constitution and discipline of the army, which laid the foundation of those numerous and splendid victories which humbled and laid low in the dust an ambitious and ruthless tyrant, replaced the liberties of Europe on a more solid basis than they have ever rested on before, and raised the reputation of the British arms to a pitch of glory seldom equalled, and never surpassed, in the history of nations; when we remember the exemplary care and attention which he paid to the health and comfort of the defenders of our country, and his unwearied endeavours to raise the character of the soldier, and to render the profession of arms respectable and honourable; and lastly, when we call to mind the provision he made for the orphans and widows of the brave men who fell in upholding their country's glory, and the support he gave to many charitable institutions; when we consider all these benefits which he conferred on his country, we cannot but regard the death of such an illustrious and benevolent Prince as a national calamity.

The Lord Chancellor has appointed William Ostler the younger, of Grantham, in the county of Lincoln, Gent. to be a Master Extraordinary in the High Court of Chancery.

WHEREAS by indenture, bearing date the 21st day of May, in the year 1750, Elizabeth Jones and the Rev. Charles Jones did grant and demise unto the Right Honourable Lord Baron Mornington, Chichester Fortescue, Samuel Bridges, and Theobald Wolfe, that plot of ground on the north side of Lazors'-hill, now Townsend-street, whereon the Westmorland Lock Hospital has since been erected, being in the county of the city of Dublin, to have and to hold unto them and the survivors and survivor of them, his heirs and assigns, for three lives therein named, with a covenant for

perpetual renewal, at and under the rent and fines therein specified; and whereas by deed of renewal, made 3d January 1752, by and between the same parties, the life of the Honourable Garrett. Wesely was substituted in place of that of His Royal Highness Frederick Prince of Wales, then late deceased, one of the lives named in said lease; and whereas all the said lessees and lives in said lease and renewal are long since dead, and the representatives or heirs or assigns of said lessees have not obtained a further renewal of said lease; and whereas all the right and interest of said lessors in and to the said premises is now vested in me, the undersigned; and whereas I have demanded on the said premises all arrears of fines and rent due out of said premises, pursuant to the Statute in such case made and provided; I hereby require the person or persons in whom the right to have a renewal of said recited lease is now vested, within two calendar months from the date hereof, to pay to me all arrears of fines and rent due out of said premises, and which I now hereby demand, otherwise I will for ever hereafter resist any claim that may be set up to a renewal under said lease.—Dated this 28th day of February 1827.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

BUCHANNESS LIGHTHOUSE.

THE Commissioners of the Northern Lighthouses hereby give notice, that a Lighthouse has been erected on Buchanness, on the coast of Aberdeenshire, forming the Eastern Foreland of Scotland, which will be lighted on Tuesday the 1st day of May next, and will continue thereafter to be exhibited every night, from the going away of day-light in the evening till the return of day-light in the morning.

The following Specification of the Position of the Lighthouse, and the Appearance of the Light, is given by Mr. Stevenson, Engineer to the Commissioners.

The peninsular piece of ground called Buchanness, is situate in lat. 57 deg. 30 min. North, and in long. 1 deg. 47 min. West. From Rattray Briggs the light will be seen over the eastern part of the town of Peterhead, bearing S. S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. distant nine miles. From Cruden Scares, N. E. distant six miles; and from Girdleness, N. E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. distant 25 miles. The lantern is open or glazed from N. by E. to S. W. by W. and intermediate points easterly. The bearings are taken by compass, and the variation is about 27 deg. West.

This light having a somewhat novel appearance, from the quick revolution of its reflector-frame, will be known to Mariners as a flashing light, or twinkling light, which, in every five seconds of time, emerges from a state of partial darkness to a transitory or momentary light, resembling a star of the first magnitude. It will thereby be readily distinguished from the slow motion and red colour of the Bell Rock Light toward the South, or from the stationary light of Kinnaird-Head toward the North.

The light will be from oil, with reflectors, elevated

130 feet above the medium level of the sea. In clear weather it will be seen at the distance of six leagues, and intermediately according to the state of the atmosphere.
