

Fortunes for the Service of his Majesty and the State. The States of *Lithuania* have undertaken to raise and bring into the Field 12000 Men at the Charge of that Dutchy.

Dantzick, June 12. The Levies that are making in *Prussia* for the Service of the Elector of *Brandenburg*, are carried on with great Diligence, and will be in a Readiness to take the Field within 3 Months. The States of that Province have in their late Diet agreed, according to his Electoral Highness's demand, to pay 30000 Rix Dollars Monthly, towards the Entertainment of his Forces.

Vienna, June 13. We have advice from the Imperial Camp before *Newbeusel*, That the Besiegers having the sixth and seventh Instant erected several Batteries, and on the eighth plac'd the great Guns and Mortar-Pieces upon them, begu'd the ninth to throw their Bombs and Grenadoes into the Town, which did great Execution, and reduced a considerable part of it into Ashes: That in the mean time the Turks who were Lodged on the Counter-scarp made a Sally, in which they lost 60 Men, and we 30, besides three Officers of Note, and that the Duke of *Lorraine* had sent the Regiments of *Halleweil*, *Ladron*, *Kbery*, and *Castelli*, to reinforce the Body of Men which is Post'd under the Command of the Palatine of *Hungary*, on the other side of the River *Neutra*. We have advice from *Greicks-Weiffembourg*, That the Grand Vizier having received certain Information that the Crown of *Poland* had concluded a defensive League with the Emperor, and in pursuance thereof was making great preparations for War, had sent a considerable supply of Money to the Basha of *Caminietz*, to enable him to raise a Body of *Cossacks*, which are to be commanded in chief by the Cham of *Tartary*, to observe the motions and oppose the designs of the *Poles*.

P. S. By a Courier arrived from the Army we have received advice, That the Duke of *Lorraine* had on the 10th Instant, in pursuance of an Order which he received from the Emperor, quitted the Siege of *Newbeusel*, and was returned to his former Camp near *Comorra*.

Hamburg, June 8. The French Ministers who came lately hither to confer with the Marquis *de Villars*, are returned to the Courts of those Princes with whom they reside. On Monday next the *Sieur Meinders* parts hence for *Berlin*, and Monsieur *Bierman*, the Danish Envoy, will in a few days after leave this place, in order to meet the King his Master in *Holstein*, who according to our last Letters from *Copenhagen*, will be at *Gluckstadt* the 17th or 18th Instant. The Differences between the Magistrates of this place and the Burghers, are again revived, and what the Issue of them will be time must discover. Yesterday the Burghers assembled about them, and continued together until two of the Clock this Morning; at eleven they met again, and are still together, the Gates of the City being all the time kept shut.

Hague, June 26. On Thursday last Prince *Cassimir* of *Nassau* returned hither from *Amsterdam*, and after a short stay here intends to go to *Groningen*, and from thence for *Germany*, to consummate his Marriage with the Princess of *Anhalt*. The States-General have appointed the Heers *Vanden Broek*, *Hecke*, and *Haerholte*, to go in quality of their Deputies into *Flanders*, as well to visit the Fortified places which belong to them in that Province, as to alter the Magistrats in the several Towns that are under their Jurisdiction. The Ship *Hollandia* (in which Count *Strum* is to Command as Admiral of the Fleet which the States have ordered to be fitted out for this Summer) pass'd the *Pampus* the 22 Instant, and is Sailed towards the *Texel*. The Heer *Lieburgens*, Governor of *Oranibow*, is arriv'd at *Amsterdam*; and the Heer *Van Somerdyke* will part

from hence the beginning of the next Month for *Surinam*, whither he carries with him 500 Soldiers, as well for the Defence as more speedy Plantation of that Colony.

Paris, June 30. On Friday last between seven and eight a Clock in the Evening there happened a kind of a *Hurricane*, at *Rouen*, which was so terrible that it would have endangered the whole Town, had it lasted. It did, for the short time of its continuance a great deal of harm, having very much shattered divers Houses, and beat down six Steeples, and two Turrets of the Cathedral, and several persons that were Swimming being drown'd: In the adjacent Country the Damage was not less, their Corn and Fruit-trees being for the most part spoiled. It is said that the Court will return sooner than was expected, and that their Most Christian Majesties will be at *Verfailles* the 18th or 20th of the next Month.

Dover, June 20. Yesterday in the afternoon pass'd by to the Eastward, a Fleet of 23 French Ships, whereof 14 were Men of War, and the rest Fireships and Tenders. We are inform'd by Passengers arriv'd from *Dunkirk*, that there lay three Frigats ready to join them.

Windfor, June 21. This day the Sheriffs and Common-Serjeant of *London*, by command of the Lord Mayor and Court of Aldermen, in pursuance of an Order of Common Council, waited on his Majesty, humbly to acquaint him that the Common Council had agreed to submit to the Regulations required by His Majesty, and had put out the Election of Sheriffs, and other Officers, which were to have been chosen on *Midsummer-Day*, until the 18th of *July* next.
