**A**T the Court at *St. James's*, the 23d day of *May* 1827,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**T**HIS day the Right Honourable James Abercromby and the Right Honourable Robert Wilmot Horton were, by His Majesty's command, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took their respective places at the Board accordingly.

**A**T the Court at *St. James's*, the 23d day of *May* 1827,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the twentieth November last, for prohibiting the exportation of gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar), has expired; and whereas it is judged expedient that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer; His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service), do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the date of this Order), presume to transport any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of

Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar) or ship or lade any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, for the transporting of the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf, first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties imposed in that behalf by an Act, passed in the sixth year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the general regulation of the Customs:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lord High Admiral, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

Undress—Grey frocks.

The Court to change the mourning on Sunday the 10th of June next, viz.

The Ladies to wear black silk or velvet, coloured ribbons, fans and tippets, or plain white, or white

and gold, or white and silver stuffs, with black ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear black coats, and black or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuff waistcoats, full trimmed, coloured swords, and buckles.

And on Sunday the 17th of June next, the Court to go out of mourning.

**T**he following Addresses, having been transmitted to the Right Honourable William Sturges Bourne, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by the several persons whose names are respectively subjoined to each Address, were presented by him to His Majesty, who was pleased to receive the same very graciously.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty:

The loyal and dutiful Address of the Inhabitants of Liverpool, convened by the Worshipful the Mayor and in the Town Hall assembled.

**W**E, the Inhabitants of Liverpool, deploring, in common with our fellow subjects, the calamity which has deprived your Majesty and the Nation of the services of that able and upright Statesman, the Right Honourable the Earl of Liverpool, approach your Majesty with sentiments of profound veneration to offer our sincere condolence on the loss which your Majesty has sustained, at the same time that we express our unfeigned attachment to your Majesty's Person and Government.

Born in a free State, and subjects of a Constitutional King, it behoves us at all times to preserve inviolate, at once, the prerogative of the Crown, the privilege of Parliament, and the rights of the people; and it is on the occasion of your Majesty's exercise of this prerogative, in the formation of a new Ministry, that we have the duty to carry to the Throne our humble and hearty congratulations.

In the generally improved commercial and domestic policy adopted by the late Government, more particularly as advocated by those Members of the Administration, who have continued their services throughout the recent changes, and especially in the firm and dignified tone in the liberal and enlightened character of the foreign policy introduced by the late Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, whom your Majesty has since been graciously pleased to call to the head of your Majesty's Councils, we find the assurance of the extension, the consolidation, and the improvement of that system of Government, so happily commenced, so consonant with the spirit of the age, and so essential to the prosperity of the Country.

Inhabitants of a large commercial town, we disguise not from your Majesty that the circumstances of the times are not without their difficulties, but it is our duty, as it is our happiness, to repeat to your Majesty, the declaration of our loyal attachment to your Majesty's Person, as well as of our cordial support of your Majesty's Government, in their efforts to raise the Nation out of present difficulties, to maintain unimpaired the true dignity of the

Crown, and to bestow renewed and increased prosperity on all classes of your Majesty's subjects.

We pray that your Majesty may long live to reign in the hearts of an affectionate, loyal and happy people.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

The humble Address of the Freemen and Inhabitants of the Town and Port of Dover.

May it please your Majesty,

**W**E, the Freemen and Inhabitants of your ancient and loyal Town and Port of Dover, in the County of Kent, beg leave to approach your Majesty with assurances of our unfeigned loyalty and attachment to your Royal Person.

While we cannot refrain from expressing the sorrow which we feel, in common with the whole Nation, at the loss which your Majesty has sustained by the lamented illness of that honest and upright Statesman, the Earl of Liverpool, we are fully sensible of the paternal care and regard evinced by your Majesty for the welfare and happiness of your subjects, in the recent changes which you have been pleased to make in your Councils.

Be the cause of the secession of those individuals who have so long enjoyed your Majesty's favour, the failure of an attempt to controul the just prerogative of the Crown, or a disinclination to serve under the enlightened and distinguished individual now at the head of your Majesty's Government, or be it from any other motive, we sincerely rejoice and heartily congratulate your Majesty on the event, which, through your Majesty's firmness and wisdom, has placed at the head of affairs men whose splendid talent and sound Constitutional principles give them so just a claim to your Majesty's high consideration, and the admiration and confidence of the Nation.

**SCHOOL OF PHYSIC IN IRELAND.**

**P**URSUANT to the 40th Geo. 3rd, commonly called the School of Physic Act, notice is hereby given, that the King's Professorship of the Institutes of Medicine, on the foundation of Sir Patrick Dun, is now vacant, in consequence of the death of the late William Stack, Bachelor in Medicine, and that on Tuesday the 2d day of October next, at twelve o'clock, the Electors appointed by and in virtue of said Act, will proceed to the election of a Professor of the Institutes of Medicine, in the room of the said William Stack, Bachelor in Medicine, deceased, at the house of the Provost of Trinity College, in the city of Dublin. The emoluments of said Professorship consist of such fees for lectures as may be regulated by the President and Fellows of the King and Queen's College of Physicians in Ireland; said fees being at present, four guineas paid by each Student for attendance on each course of lectures on the Institutes of Medicine; and of three guineas paid by each Student for each course of Clinical Lectures; and of a fixed annual salary of one hundred pounds, late Irish currency. Said Professorship is open to persons of all nations, professing their faith in Christ, provided they shall have taken medical degrees, or shall have obtained a licence to practice from the said College of Physicians, in consequence of a testimonium under the seal of Trinity College, Dublin.

All persons intending to offer themselves as Candidates must send in their names, with the places of their education, the Universities in which they have taken their medical degrees, and the places where they have practiced, both to the Register of Trinity College, Dublin, and to the Register of the King and Queen's College of Physicians in Ireland; to be by them laid before the two Colleges respectively.
