THE following Address, having been transmitted to the Right Honourable William Sturges Bourne, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, was presented by him to His Majesty, who was pleased to receive the same very graciously :

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

SIRE,

WE, the undersigned free and independent Electors for the Borough of Great Marlow, beg, with the profoundest respect, reverence, and submission, to express our gratification and delight at the resolute, magnanimous, and determined line of conduct which your Majesty displayed on a late occasion, when so many of your Cabinet Ministers, as if by a preconcerted plan, forsook the Councils of their Sovereign in a crisis of peculiar difficulty and distress.

We heartily congratulate your Majesty on a selection of other Ministers to supply the places of the seceders, on whose prudence, wisdom, and virtue we rely with unbounded confidence; on whose liberal and enlightened policy we depend for deliverance from every grievance, and by whose exertions we doubt not but that the differences hitherto subsisting between sectaries of various tenets of religion, will be so happily healed that equal rights may be safely and indiscriminately extended to all; and that such sapient measures will speedily be adopted as shall cement every party in one universal compact of strength, amity, and concord.

Accept, Most Gracious Sovereign, these heartfelt effusions of your dutiful and loyal subjects, free and independent Electors for the Borough of Great Marlow, who humbly subscribe themselves, with sincerity and devotion, Most Illustrious Sire, your Majesty's most faithful, affectionate, and obedient servants.
