PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the twentieth November last, for prohibiting the exportation of gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Straights of Gibraltar), has expired; and whereas it is judged expedient that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer; His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service), do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the date of this Order), presume to transport any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Straights of Gibraltar) or ship or lade any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, for the transporting of the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties imposed in that behalf by an Act, passed in the sixth year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the general regulation of the Customs:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lord High Admiral, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions hereip as, to them may respectively appertain.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS certain dues and duties are payable to His Majesty within the Ports of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, and Sark, upon the anchorage of foreign ships, vessels, and boats arriving at and casting anchor within the ports, roads, and havens of the said islands, commonly called anchorage dues; and which anchorage dues are not payable by or in respect of British ships, vessels, or boats arriving at and casting anchor within the said ports, roads, and havens; and whereas by certain Treaties or Conventions of Commerce made and concluded by His Majesty with His Most Christian Majesty the King of France, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of January one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six; and with His Majesty the King of Denmark, bearing date the sixteenth day of June one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four; and with His Majesty the King of Prussia, bearing date the second day of April one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four; and with His Majesty as King of Hanover, bearing date the twelfth day of June one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four; and with His Majesty the King of Sweden and Norway, bearing date the eighteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six; and with the United States of America, bearing date the third day of July one thousand eight hundred and fifteen; and with the Free Hanseatic Republics, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of September one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five; and with the State of Columbia, bearing date the eighteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five; and with the United Provinces of Rio de la Plata, bearing date the second day of February one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, it is, amongst other things, agreed, that during the continuance of such Treaties respectively, vessels of and belonging to the subjects of the before-mentioned foreign Sovereigns and States, entering or departing from the ports of the United Kingdom of Great Bri-

tain and Ireland, shall not be subject to any other or higher duties or charges whatever than are or shall be levied on British vessels entering or departing from such ports; His Majesty, being desirous to carry the said Treaties into full execution and effect, is pleased, with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that during the continuance of the before-mentioned Treaties or Conventions of Commerce respectively, and so long as the same shall respectively remain in force, the before-mentioned anchorage dues heretofore levied or claimed in the said islands of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, and Sark, on ships, vessels, and boats, of or belonging to the subjects of His Most Christian Majesty, or of His Majesty the King of Denmark, or of His Majesty the King of Prussia, or of His Majesty as King of Hanover, or of His Majesty the King of Sweden and Norway, or of the United States of America, or of the Free Hanseatic Republics, or of the State of Columbia, or of the United Provinces of Rio de la Plata, shall be and the same are hereby repealed, abolished, and remitted, any law, custom, or usage, now or at any time heretofore in force in the said islands, or any of them, to the contrary notwithstanding; provided always, that nothing in this present Order contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any ships, vessels, or boats of or belonging to the subjects of the United Provinces of Rio de la Plata, not being of the burthen of above one hundred and twenty tons, such ships, vessels, or boats not being included within the said Treaty with the said United Provinces, of the second of February one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five: and it is further ordered, that the said anchorage dues shall in like manner be and the same are hereby repealed, abolished, and remitted in favour of the ships, vessels, and boats of or belonging to the subjects of any other foreign State or Power with whom His Majesty shall hereafter enter into and conclude any such Treaty as aforesaid; and that such repeal, abolition, and remission shall take effect when and so soon as the conclusion of any such future Treaty shall be signified to the Governor or Lieutenant-Governor of the said islands respectively, by His Majesty through one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State; and all Governors, Lieutenant-Governors, and other Officers, civil and military, and all other His Majesty's subjects within the said islands, are to take notice hereof and to govern themselves accordingly:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable William Sturges Bourne, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS in and by a certain Act of Parliament, made and passed in the fifth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend and

consolidate the laws relating to the abolition of "the slave trade," parts of the net proceeds of ships and cargoes taken and condemned for illegal trading in slaves, as therein provided, and also certain bounties and other sums of money therein specified, are made payable to the Commanders, Officers, and crews of such of His Majesty's ships as shall seize and capture the same, subject to such distribution as His Majesty shall think fit and direct by any Order in Council to be made for that purpose:

In pursuance of the powers so given, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and direct, and it is hereby ordered and directed, that all and every the proceeds, bounties, and other sums of money, which have become payable as aforesaid, and remain undistributed, or which shall become payable as aforesaid under and by virtue of the said recited Act, subject to such order of distribution so to be made as aforesaid, shall be distributed and divided amongst the captors or seizers thereof, in such manner, form, and proportion, and according to such rules and regulations as are directed and provided by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the twenty-third of June one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, for the distribution of the shares of any such seizures as are and shall, by virtue of any Acts relating to the trade and revenues of His Majesty's dominions, be payable to and amongst the Commanders, Officers, and crews of any of His Majesty's ships:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-seventh year of His late Majesty's reign, cap. 57, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to suspend training and regulate the quotas of the militia," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by any Order or Orders in Council, to suspend the calling out of the militia of the United Kingdom, or any part of the United Kingdom, or of any county, riding, shire, stewartry, city, town, or place, for the purpose of being trained and exercised in any year, and to order and direct that no training or exercising of the militia of the United Kingdom, or of any part of the United Kingdom, or of any county or counties, riding or ridings, shire or shires, stewartry or stewartries, city or cities, town or towns, or place or places, specified in any such Order or Orders in Council, shall take place in any year, any thing contained in any Act or Acts of Parliament relating to the militia to the contrary notwithstanding: and whereas it is deemed expedient, that such training or exercising should be dispensed with in the present year; it is ordered by His Ma-

jesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the calling out of the militia of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain, for the purpose of being trained and exercised in the present year, be suspended; and that no training or exercising of the said militia do take place in the present year.

Westminster, June 23, 1827.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act to defray the charge of the pay, clothing, and contingent and other expences of the disembodied militia in Great Britain and Ireland, and to grant allowances in certain cases to Subaltern Officers, Adjutants, Quartermasters, Surgeons, Assistant-Surgeons, Surgeons-Mates, and Sergeant-Majors of Militia, until the twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight.

An Act to appoint Commissioners for carrying into execution several Acts granting an aid to His Majesty by a land tax to be raised in Great Britain; and continuing to His Majesty certain duties on personal estates, offices, and pensions in England.

An Act for the further amendment and extension of the powers of the several Acts authorising advances for carrying on public works.

An Act to provide for the payment of a salary (in lieu of fees) to the Judge of the Prerogative Court and Court of Faculties in Ireland.

An Act to consolidate and amend the laws in force in Ireland, for unions and divisions of parishes, and for uniting or disappropriating appropriate parishes, or parts of parishes; and to make further provision with respect to the erecting chapels of ease and making perpetual cures.

An Act for further amending an Act, passed in the fourth year of His present Majesty's reign, for the better administration of justice in the equity side of the Court of Exchequer in Ireland.

An Act to continue, until the first day of June one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight, and from thence to the end of the then next session of Parliament, an Act of the third year of His present Majesty, for regulating the manner of licensing ale-houses in England.

An Act to exempt persons who have procured game certificates in Great Britain, from the duty on game certificates in Ireland, and to authorise persons who have paid duty on game certificates in Ireland, to kill game in Great Britain, upon paying the additional duty only.

An Act for the better enabling the Commissioners appointed by an Act passed in the third year of His present Majesty, to complete the buildings of His Majesty's General Register House at Edinburgh.

An Act to allow, until the twenty-fourth day of October one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven, the inrolment of certain articles of clerkship and assignments thereof.

An Act for erecting a church in the parish of Doncaster, in the west riding of the county of York.

An Act for building a new gaol for the town of Cambridge, and for other purposes connected therewith.

And one private Act.

THE following Address, having been transmitted to the Right Honourable William Sturges Bourne, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, was presented by him to His Majesty, who was pleased to receive the same very graciously:

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

The humble Address of the undersigned Inhabitants of the City of Carlisle, in public meeting assembled.

May it please your Majesty,

THE Inhabitants of the City of Carlisle, in public meeting assembled, desire to approach your Majesty's Throne with their heartfelt congratulations on the present aspect of your Majesty's Government.

The nation, Sire, during a period of great commercial embarrassment and distress, has observed in some of the measures that originated with your Majesty's Government, a determination not to underrate its difficulties, not to meet them with temporary and fallacious expedients, but to endeavour, by a more just and enduring policy, to lay the foundations of a lasting prosperity.

As equally connected with its welfare and honour, it has seen an improvement in its foreign policy, calculated to convince the world, that the strength of Great Britain is independent of foreign confederations, that it consists in the free principles of its Government, and in the natural relation of those principles to the wants and the growing intelligence of your Majesty's loyal subjects.

It has beheld in some recent secessions from your Majesty's Councils, a disposition to interrupt this happy system, but, Sire, the result is a just theme of congratulation. It has shown that to your Majesty's firmness upon this trying occasion, the country is indebted for an Administration composed chiefly of individuals who, in a divided Council or in Parliament, were the promoters of those very measures which have been viewed with so much satisfaction, and who add to an enlightened foreign and commercial policy, a corresponding liberality of sentiment on questions of civil government.

Such, Sire, are the agreeable anticipations with which the inhabitants of the city of Carlisle hasten to assure your Majesty, that a steady prosecution of these principles in the general policy of the country will confirm their confidence in the wisdom of your

Majesty's Councils; and they pray that your Majesty may long live to reign in the hearts of a loyal and affectionate people.
