T casenable Consultations to Levy Men, and to m he an Insurrection within the Our Kingdom; And bing give to understand that the said Criminals are fled, and left their cabitations to avoid the Justice of Our Laws; We have therefore thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Iriny Council, to Publish Our with the advice of Our Irivy Council, to Publish Our Royal Pleasure, And We do kereby strilly Charge and Command the sail James Duke of M amouth, Ford Lord Gray, Sir Thomas Armitrong, and Robert Ferguson, and every of them, forthwith to render themselves to some of Our Judges or Justices of Peace, in order to their Prosecution according to Law. And We do bereby Require and Command as well all and singular ou Judges, Justices of the Peace, Majors, Sherists. Constables, and Headboroughs, as also the Officers and Ministers of Our Ports, and all also the Officers and Ministers of Our Ports, and all other our Subjects whatsever within Our Realms of England, Scotland, Ireland, or Dominion of Wales, England, Scotland, Ireland, or Dominion of Wales, and all other Our Dominions and Territories, to be diligent in enquiring and searching for the said Offenders in all places whatsoever, as well within Liberties as without: And if they shall happen to take any of them, or that they shall render themselves, Our further Will and Pleasure u. That they cause him or them so Apprehended, to be suffly varied before the next Justice of the Peace to the place where he or they shall be directed, whom We strictly Charge to commit to Prison, and presently Inform Us, or Our Privy Council, of such Apprehension. And we do hereby further Declare and Publish, That if any Person or Persons, after this Our Praclamation, shall directly or indirectly conceal, barbour, keep, retain or mainor indirectly conceal, barbour, keep, retain or maintain the fail Offenders, or any of them, or shall convive or consider at any means volereby they or any if them may escape from being Taken or Arrested, or shall not use their helt Endeavours for the Apprehension of them, as well by giving due Advertisement thereof to Our Officers, as by all other good means. We will (as there is just cause) proceed against them that shall so negled this Our Commandment with all Severity. That whosomer shall discour the said Offenders, or any of them, either within our Kingdoms of England, Scotland, Ireland, or Dominion of Wales, or in any other Our Dominions, and Territo-Wales, or in any other Our Dominions, and the Our Dominions of Control Our Dominio

ries, or elsewhere beyond the Seas, and Thall cause them or any of them to be Apprehended and brought in as aforesaid, shall have a Reward of Five hundred Pounds for each of the said Persons, to be paid unto him in Recompence of such bu Service.

The Viceroy of Croatia is Encamped with a Rody of 6000 Men on the River Drave, to observe the mo ions of the Turks, and becare the Country from the Incurtions of the Gari'ons of Canifa, and other places belonging to the lurks. The Vallages on the Rask are furtified, and the Counts of Trajegwine and But diani are appointed to Guard them with a Body of 6000 Hungarians. The Prince of Libomirski and General Schuiz are Encamped near Tran-Our Letters from Roland fay, That that King is sending a considerable Detachment towards Train fivance, to make a diversion, and himsel the junction of His co Abass and Count Technier with the Grand-Vizier, whose Army, according to our fresher Letters, will not confilt of above 90000 effective Men.
